MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

The Life and Language of Praise

"Such knowledge is too wonderful for me." ~Psalm 139:6

The Book of Psalms is strange and wonderful. It is strange because it is filled with the excessive language of praise that is, at times, so over-the-top that it sounds imaginary and disconnected from reality. What could possibly warrant such extreme language? It is wonderful because it is the poetry of a life in relationship to God, filled with beautiful descriptions of joy and hardship that any human being might identify with.

The words of praise in the psalms are reaching as far as language can reach to speak of God. From the heavens above to Sheol below, there is nothing that God does not encompass. No preposition can describe where God is not. And no superlative can stretch too far the description of God. These are words at the limits of language, revealing to us that God is not ours to manage or control.

The language of praise reveals that a relationship with God is not defined by saying the right words. What cannot be controlled by words however can be experienced by a life. When the psalmist sings about all the ways that God knows us, the psalmist adds that such knowledge is "too wonderful." When we experience God, we experience something beyond our reckoning. We cannot explain it or control it.

And so, we are driven, like the psalmist, back to the language of praise. We cannot give a calculation of our lives or the gift of life itself, and so we express in language this failure of any calculation by using words at the limit of language: heaven, Sheol, a position too high for us, a place beyond our attainment.

And we live in relationship to this Mystery that we cannot control. We do so by giving our lives to the highest values and principles that we know: Goodness, Justice, Mercy, Sacrifice. These are the best expressions of our relationship to God. When we live in accordance with these highest values, our lives, more than our words, sing praise to God.

PILGRIM PROFILES



It seems appropriate in July, the month of patriotic displays, to interview one of our members who is a veteran, not only of the Navy but also of city government. Don Kendrick was raised in the Methodist church in La Verne. After six years in the Navy, he returned to La Verne. Not finding what he needed at his old church, he was invited to Pilgrim by his sister Virginia St. Clair. He was immediately struck by Ben Gaskell's sermon and transferred his membership in the mid 1970's.

Don's first church job was as an usher, which lasted around 45 years, until the pandemic. He also served on the Diaconate Board, Board of Trustees and the Nominating Board. While on the Nominating Board Don asked women to serve as ushers. Previously only men had ushered. The unanimous decision was "It's about time!" Another special project he took on was recruiting members to give the children's message on Sundays. Rev. Donald Keepers had been doing a "brown bag" children's sermon but it had fallen by the wayside. Don Kendrick stepped up and recruited members to

take on the task and thus spare the ministerial staff from the extra work. No one declined the job and the Senior Minister at the time, Dr. Fox, asked to add his name to the list. That was over 30 years ago and it's still going strong. Don feels it is a great tribute to our members' dedication.

Don has had a varied career, starting with his childhood tasks on his parents' chicken ranch in La Verne and going on to serve 6 years in the Navy, four of which were on the nuclear submarine USS James Monroe. After his honorable discharge he spent 10 years in the Cask N Cleaver restaurant organization starting as a cook and moving up to becoming an owner! In 1984 Don started in residential real estate, 39 years in the business so far and out of that, 31 years as Don Kendrick Real Estate Company. Don Kendrick served as La Verne Mayor for 11 years. He served the previous 4 years as a city council member, preceded by over 6 years on the Planning Commission.

His main hobby is wood working in his personal wood shop which he created over the last 20+ years. In addition, he enjoys reading non-fiction. He and his wife Gaynel enjoy traveling and being with other people.







SUCCESSFUL SUCESSION TRAINING SESSION



The first of the Pilgrim series of "Succession Training" seminars designed for members currently serving on Boards and in service roles for the church was held on Saturday June 3rd. The purpose of these two hour sessions is to draw in Pilgrim members who might be interested in participating and contributing to the creativity and operations of our church in many many different ways. At each session, information about what each assignment actually does is presented and there is opportunity to ask questions and to demystify how things get done. It is hoped that attendees will want to join in on one or several of the many openings of fellowship and service.

Another benefit of the "Succession Seminars" is that when Board Chairs, Board Members, Church Council members prepare presentations about their roles,clarification and focus takes place and the roles are freshened and updated via questions from fellow Pilgrims in attendance. As Chair of these sessions, Rev. Horn ties our roles and activities into Congregational Principles and to the uniqueness and independence of our Pomona Church.

As Church Historian, of course I got to thinking about..... "How would I describe the role and focus of historian of a 136 year old church?" Giving this some thought made me realize that **there are actually two layers of** "**history**" going on with us as we go forward:

- #1. Pilgrim **HAS** a long and great history.
- #2. And Pilgrim **is MAKING great history** in the now and during every year going forward.

As to the first function of the Historian, the job is to discover, protect and preserve artifacts, ledgers, photos, rosters, biographical data, chronological data, community connection, membership rosters, staff rosters, War service rosters, event records and programs, publicity records, construction records, fundraising efforts, entertainments, newsletters and publications, ministerial / sermon records, honors, recognitions and citations, etc. In other words: sorting and organizing closets full of records and putting them in an order in which they may be accessed by the congregation and/or researchers. This is what is meant by " discover, protect and preserve" the great trove of our great history.

The second layer of our "history" is the history that Pilgrims are making NOW in the present. The history that also must be protected, preserved and communicated among the congregation. History is truly an ongoing process. World, national, local community and church events shape us. We shape our church and our community. Thinking about the past five years or so alone, look at what we adapted to : The challenge of Covid: The shutdown of assembled worship; the constraints of observing Christmas, Easter, Auctions, Parking lot events, Rummage Sales. Pilgrim ADAPTED. Pilgrim found new ways, creative ways to keep fellowship alive and to keep our traditions. History was made with livestreamed worship services... drive through Ash Wednesday..... piecemeal parking lot Rummage events parking lot opera and musical programs..... on line auctions.... Zoom meeting Devotionals and Church Council Meetings. Pilgrim Library delivering books to homes. Pilgrim made history by celebrating its history with the much-appreciated Community Celebration of our 135th Anniversary Open House event. In previous years Pilgrim has opened to the community for Heritage Home Tours, Bridal Reunions,....... filming site for movies..... Neighborhood Watch Meetings, Voter Election Staff Training....Rental venues....Blood Drives Website developmentSilent Movie Night Choir fundraisers..... so many things. And Pilgrim has "grown the church" meeting the challenges of maintaining and enlarging church attendance during times of technological and philosophical change.

Oh yes, we are making history in the NOW and for the future.


