## A Fire in the Bones

**“There is something like a burning fire shut up in my bones.”  
~ Jeremiah 20:9**

The prophet Jeremiah was persecuted by his own people because the Lord's message was not what they wanted to hear. Jeremiah's suffering was so intense that he tried to quiet himself and not draw the attention of the people. But he couldn't do it. He said that the Lord's message was like a fire in his bones that he couldn't quench. He had to speak up; he had to remain faithful to the cause.

The cause was obedience to God. The covenant that God made with the people of Israel, liberated from slavery, and directed to the promised land, included their commitment to following the Ten Commandments and the prophesies of the Lord's prophets. As the people rejected that cause, through their injustices and their mistreatment of immigrants, orphans, and widows, Jeremiah refused to remain quiet. The fire in his bones would not let him stifle the word of the Lord.


For many of us, our love for Pilgrim Church is like a fire in the bones. We couldn't quench it if we wanted to. And why would we? We need to let that fire, that passion for Pilgrim Church, burn and grow. We need to let it burn for service to one another and the world. We need to let it burn in our commitment to the cause of obedience to God. That fire in our bones must be allowed to burn brighter.

## MESSAGE FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER CONTINUED

The fire burned bright in the life of our second senior minister, Rev. Lucien Frary, who served from 1888 to 1903. After the founding minister, Dr. Charles Sumner, had served for a year and shifted his attention to the development of the church's college, Pomona College, Rev. Frary led Pilgrim Congregational Church through a period of growth in membership and in spiritual maturity. The fire in the bones of these early Pilgrims helped to make us who we are, today.

That fire is very much like the fire in Jeremiah's bones. It's about God's people being good and doing what is right. For us contemporary Pilgrims, it's about being a source of love in our community. The fire is a determination to use our resources and influence to spread the Good News of God's grace in Christ. That fire in our bones, if we will let it burn, will ensure that Pilgrim Congregational Church will be here for many decades to come, providing space and encouragement for those who wish to join the journey with God.

# "Congregational-ness"

## How Pilgrim has Engaged New Members Over the Decades

*Approximately 40 years ago -- Pilgrim Church prepared a membership recruiting pamphlet to help members explain who we are. The pamphlet was a summary and guide to "what it means to be a Pilgrim in this church", the benefits of membership, and an explanation of the unique-ness of congregationalism among other Protestant church denominations.*

*This publication appears useful and relevant four decades later as people emerging from pandemic isolation seek connection and affiliation with their communities.*

*Some portions of the recruitment guide from 1982 are excerpted here for possible use by our current members in sharing "Pilgrim-ness" with prospective new members showing interest in our church.*

### *Why belong to a church ?*

"There is a sense of inner security and peace in the possession of a church home, which once experienced deeply, never deserts you. Your religious experience establishes a relationship with life which provides a bulwark in times of distress, great grief and difficulty. Your church serves as a uniting force for the entire family. "They who pray together, stay together' is not a slogan of small support. Your church is the healthiest of family ties. You are a part of the elevation of your community to higher moral and spiritual realities. In this you find your own life enriched."

"You are the example to your children for the only worthwhile manner of life. Children strengthened by early religious education and contacts gain a steadying influence which remains helpful throughout their lives. Only by the example and participation of the parent can greatest benefit come to them. You are never happier inwardly than when attempting to live that ultimate reality we know as right and in the light of God. You are near to this in your church home."



### *The Congregational Way*

"A Congregational Church is not a church of Congregationalists, but a church of Christians in which the congregation governs." (The following is an attempt to define congregationalism but is not an official statement of the church). "Encounter with God is the essential thing. There is no single declaration of doctrine. In leaving Europe to settle in America it was possible to unite the Puritans' desire for order with the Pilgrims' desire for freedom and to form the churches of the Congregational Way. By their statements on the one-ness of God, the person of Christ, the Holy Spirit, the nature of mankind, the authority of the Bible, the character of the Church, they have placed themselves in the central stream of Christian thought."

## HISTORIAN'S REPORT CONTINUED

"When a person becomes a member of a Congregational church, that person enters a church relationship based on a covenant or purpose which each church adopts for itself. Each member's journey is a personal path amid a church community of support and belonging. Pilgrim Congregational Church of Pomona agrees by covenant to maintain the institutions of the Gospel, to submit to the orderly administration of the affairs of the church and to walk together in brotherly love. At Pilgrim, church members talk things over and vote to confirm Pilgrim's ministerial appointments, church budgets, emergency resolutions and procedural changes at 'Town Hall' discussion meetings."

"Such a purpose allows each individual full freedom in the expression of faith, but unites each with others in a responsible fellowship of common purpose.. We base our churchmanship upon the amazing assurance that 'wherever two or three are gathered together in My name, there I am in the midst of them.'"

### *How do people become members of Pilgrim Church?*

"In simple statement, Pilgrim Church wants you. To join with us you have but to want Pilgrim Church and have religious purpose in your life." Please visit our worship services, feel welcome at our programs and community activities, chat with our members, ask questions and meet with our Minister.

**Liturgical Notes by Dr. Horn:** Green is the color for the month of July 2021. Green symbolizes growth and life, hope and anticipation. Green is used in Ordinary time, the period of the Church calendar which gives attention to the Lord's life and ministry; it reminds us that the mission of the Church is to love the world and share the hope of Christ.
