Vicinage Council

At 10 am on Saturday March 28th Pilgrim Congregational Church will host a Vicinage Council for the purpose of examining Dr. Patrick Horn for ordination. These passages from Dr. Elizabeth Mauro's *The Art and Practice of the Congregational Way* explain the purpose of a Vicinage Council:

A Vicinage Council is called by a local church, acknowledging its shared fellowship with these other Congregational churches. Because these churches have been in fellowship together, the representatives of the vicinage can offer wisdom to the church grounded in their knowledge of each other. The request for an Ecclesiastical Council of the Vicinage is so important to Congregational fellowship that it should be regarded as a high priority and sacred duty in our Congregational Way. Invited churches should make every concerted effort to participate in the council. Those who attend the council become a vehicle for the Holy Spirit to guide the church that is seeking discernment and advice.

In Vicinage Councils called for the purpose of ordination, a church asks the council representatives to "examine" the candidate it is proposing for ordination, to confirm or redirect its decision. The holding of a Vicinage Council also helps the new minister establish and sustain a relationship with the churches of the association. (Dr. Mauro's entire book is available for free online at https://www.naccc.org/uploads/6/0/0/9/6009825/the art and practice of the congregational way.pdf.)

Members of the Pilgrim congregation are invited to observe this council meeting, though there will be a time of confidential consultation between the examiners. At that time, everyone that is not an examiner will be excused from the room. Please offer your prayerful support to both Dr. Horn and the local Congregational ministers who will convene this Vicinage Council.






