Love the One You See

We gotta love the people around us, the people we see. We must not let people become invisible to us. Our cultural systems (shopping, eating, exercising, entertainment, working, etc.) are set up to encourage as little genuine human interaction as possible. And, I confess, I do enjoy the easy anonymity of these systems. I can go into a grocery store and shop for an hour and not exchange more than 6 words with the people there. People are often a pain to deal with, and the less I know about them, the easier it is to get on with my own business. It takes time and energy to actually see someone, to look into their faces and care for them.

But when I ignore those around me and fail to look into their faces, I am the one who loses. I am the one who misses an opportunity to live. I am the one who fails to love God. Care and companionship is what we are created for. To fail that is to fail our Creator. This is the essence of the gospel message: that salvation from this failure rests in the one who bids us to love as he loves.

We don't have to care for and love every individual in the world, but we should be able to love every individual in our orbit. We should be able to love the ones we see. I know that it's harder to love some people than others. I know that some people may not deserve our love. But love is not always a mushy good feeling; sometimes it's hard work. And love is what we are created for and called to.

It begins with those we can see around us. But God doesn't call us to love those around us just for their sakes; we are called to this love for our own sakes, too. This love that blossoms in care and concern for others, brings deep peace and joy to our own lives. This was what Jesus tried to teach to his disciples, to love as God loves.

True love, God's love, is not a matter of loving the good things in people; true love is a matter of loving the person, the person that you see in front of you, including the faults and imperfections. We are thus not called to find people that are lovable, but to love those people that we see. In loving those we see, we may be able to love God, whom we cannot see.





SHARING HISTORY

Pilgrim's Gymnasium Over The Years

In 2003, the Inland Pacific Ballet Company of Montclair came to Pilgrim Congregational Church to perform a special Sunday afternoon costumed performance of "*The Little Mermaid*" ballet in our church gymnasium. The family-oriented event offered the children of our members and our neighborhood community a memorable exposure to the arts in an informal setting...right in their Pilgrim Church home!

For this matinee, Pilgrim's gymnasium was set up with floor mats for seating all around the four walls so that all audience members had "front row seats" with their families and could be fully immersed in the show. Many young daughters and ballet enthusiasts attended the performance wearing tutus of their own and quickly fell under the spell of this up-close and magical performance. Credit for Pilgrim's good fortune in facilitating this experience goes to Pilgrim's own Jeannie Nolden, long treasured by the Inland Pacific Ballet Company as their principal costume creator/designer.

In 1910, when Pilgrims established the plans for our Garey Avenue church, the visionary idea of including a church gymnasium was proposed... a feature that would foster family-centered social, recreational and entertainment activities as an adjunct to worship. The membership approved and budgeted the gymnasium and included the construction in the original building plans. This gymnasium is credited with being the first such church-gymnasium built west of the Mississippi River and enjoyment of the many creative uses of the gym continues to this day.



Little-known facts about the Pilgrim gymnasium

- ◆ The original gym featured a one lane bowling alley, which ran the length of the north wall of the gym (where the kitchen is now).
- ◆ The Boys Brigade used the gym for drills and training for many years and Pilgrim took a leadership role in Pomona's Brigade activities during WWII.
- ◆ The gym is fitted for and has been used for full court basketball games; and at one time there were spectator bleachers where the kitchen is now. Basketball, volleyball and many other sports and games have been played in the gym by local firefighters, Pilgrim youth groups and several other community members.

SHARING HISTORY

Pilgrim's Gymnasium Over The Years continued...

For well over a century now, a great variety of church and community needs and uses of our gym have evolved and the gym has been in continuous use and service.

Here are just a few of the gym activities that come to mind:

- ◆ Church suppers from the 1930's on forward
- ◆ Used as a dance floor and other entertainments
- ◆ Women's Auxiliary meals and programs
- ◆ Side-By-Side dinners, discussion groups and programs
- ◆ Meeting room and project area for Women's' Guilds, including Red Cross/ Bandaging projects during WWII
- ◆ Church breakfasts
- ◆ Craft sales, art exhibits, bazaars, and fundraisers
- ◆ Major church fundraisers such as the Rummage Sale and Harvest Festival
- ◆ Wall displays of quilts made by Pilgrim's Quilting Group
- ◆ Choir night performances
- ◆ Harvest Festivals including children's games, costume competitions and pumpkin decorating contests
- ◆ Wedding receptions and bridal showers
- ◆ Memorial service and celebration of life receptions
- ◆ Site of the Pomona Inland Valley Martin Luther King Jr. Project annual program and scholarship awards
- ◆ Community blood drive donation site
- ◆ Assembly area for large church projects needing table space

Surely you might recall many other uses not listed here and I'd love to hear your memories and input! We have been truly fortunate to have this versatile and spacious area for Pilgrim and community projects spanning so many decades.

Liturgical Notes by Dr. Horn for May 2, 9, 16, 30: White symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and thus it was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the liturgical color of Christmas and Easter.

Liturgical Notes by Dr. Horn for May 23: Red is the color of passion, sacrifice, and blood, and is used during Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and the feasts of the apostles and the martyrs. Red also symbolizes fire and is thus also displayed in connection with the Holy Spirit and Pentecost.

Mission: Pilgrim Congregational Church is an independent community of Christian faith which glorifies God through worship and service to others, respects individual spiritual growth, and inspires compassionate fellowship.

Vision: Pilgrim Congregational Church is the spiritual home of our community where all people are welcomed, known, and loved.




