The Rule of Grace

"So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him."

~ Luke 15:20

Perhaps the most powerful parable in the Gospels is the story of the prodigal son. The younger son foolishly asks for an early inheritance, leaves home, and quickly loses it all. He is destitute, having only a share of what was fed to the pigs, when he remembered that his father's servants had plenty of bread and more to eat. So, he decided to go back home and throw himself at the mercy of his father and ask to live among the servants.

The father does not even give the young man a chance to ask his father if he could be taken on as a servant. A robe is brought out for the son to wear, and a celebration immediately ensues. The father does not say a word about the son's poor choices; he simply embraces him and celebrates his return.

This is the rule of grace. It does not take account or try to balance the books. Love, compassion, and forgiveness pour forth without measure. "My cup runneth over." An experience of grace is something that shocks us because it is so unexpected.

Can we appreciate grace when it is enjoyed by others? Can we recognize grace in our own lives? The rule of grace is not just what we enjoy from God; it is also the rule that followers of Christ live by. We are called to offer this grace to those around us, to respond with love, compassion, and forgiveness when the norm would be to expect restitution and compensation.

The standard for our relationships with one another and with the world is not fair and just compensation, but the Lord's rule of grace.


The Welcome Home Campaign will continue to support membership expansion and as a congregation, we will continue to thrive. If you have ideas, suggestions, or input on how to



Liturgical Notes by Dr. Horn: Purple was originally associated with royalty because it was a more expensive color to dye, and it was used to welcome the coming of a king. It also evokes pain and suffering. Purple symbolizes fasting, faith, patience and trust. It is the liturgical color used during the seasons of penance, Advent, and Lent. For Advent, purple symbolizes the impending birth of Jesus while foreshadowing his death.
