# Christ in you, the hope of Glory.

"To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery which is Christ in you, the hope of Glory."

~ *Colossians* 1:27

Knowing a secret can make a person feel very powerful. When you know a secret, you have knowledge that others don't have. Many religious traditions have been built on the idea that only certain people have access to an important secret. If you become a true devotee in that tradition, you may get access to the secret, and become a powerful figure in the tradition.

Paul believed that Christ was the revelation of the greatest secret of the universe: that God loves and redeems the whole of creation through the sacrificial love of Christ. The great secret is no longer a secret. For Paul, there is no hidden knowledge available to a select group of people.

The open secret is that God loves everyone, and Christ has shown this to be irrefutably true. Nothing is hidden. God is love, and no group is more deserving of this love than any other group. This information is not secretly guarded for some special group. It is a free and open fact that, in Christ, we are all loved by God and not separated from one another.

Paul takes it a step further. Not only are we loved by God, but in Christ, we are drawn into that love so that we become participants in it and sharers of that love for Creation. This is what he means when he writes, "Christ in you, the hope of glory." It is in and through us that God loves creation. We become the hope of glory.

We may be tempted at times to think that our circle of influence is too small to make a significant difference in the world. We have only a very small group of friends, and perhaps a smaller number of living family members. But Paul says, "We are the hope of glory." Our relations to one another are features of God's redemptive love, and we are the bearers of God's hope to the world.

There are no more secrets. God loves everyone. Let us be God's love of the world.



# NAPF/HOPE REPORTS

After two cancelled conferences and a virtual conference last year, Pilgrim youth finally got to travel to NAPF/HOPE this year in Wichita, Kansas. Traveling this year was Samantha, Berlyne and Emmanuel and Christian. It was an amazing experience where they met new friends from around the country, shared in faith building activities such as worship, praise music, inspiring speaker led sessions and small groups. They met up with the adult conference for Sunday Worship at Plymouth Congregational Church. They also joined the adult conference for workshops on life skills such as financial skills and available Christian universities that offer more than religious studies at reasonable cost. At this event 4 youth, 2 from Pilgrim Church, Pomona (Berlyne & Christian) were selected to be on a panel where representatives from churches across the United States asked the question, "How do we get young people to church?" As you would expect, they did fantastic. They also participated in mission trips where they worked with organizations that helped those who are homeless or struggling. There was also downtime when they enjoyed hanging out in the common area of the Newman University dorms where we staved, playing games like ping pong, corn hole, Uno and more, surprise milkshake night and an afternoon at the waterpark. The crew from Pomona, California spent a day following conference exploring Wichita. They went on the hunt for the troll of Wichita, viewed War-Time memorials along the Arkansas River and witnessed the lighting of the flames at the base of the Keeper of the Plains where the little Arkansas and Arkansas rivers meet before flying home the next day.

Hello, my name is **Berlyne Stillions** and last month I went to the NAPF and HOPE conference that took place in Wichita, Kansas. That week was filled with so many wonderful memories that everyone made with each other, laughter, breathtaking worships, as well as helping so many others. For our mission trip we were split into 2 groups and the group that I was placed in was to work at a shelter called "The Lord's Diner." The Lord's Diner is a company that gives free food to the homeless every single day and they have stayed open every day for the last 20 years feeding the people who cannot afford food. What I did was only a portion of what needed to be done and the whole group finished everything so fast the people who owned the place did not have anything left for us to do. During the first half, before lunch, I had to put hundreds of mini donuts on trays to prepare for a handout. Next my friends and I swept the kitchen, cleaned counters and broke down boxes. Soon after that we all gathered together and made cards for some of the bags that were to be passed out. Then after we had eaten lunch we helped a worker carry food from her car to the "pantry", which was a big room with canned food. I helped organize the food and place everything on the shelves. Other people in that room have made over a hundred sandwiches for that day to give out. Helping people is so important because it can show them that people care. Doing something as little as a smile can bring someone up who was having a bad day. Helping people can be like a chain reaction, when you do something good or spread kindness, it can give them the courage to do the same.

My name is **Christian Campbell** and this is the 5th conference I have attended, but my first year as HOPE. I love the opportunities to travel to new places and meet new friends and to discuss faith with others in a non-judgmental loving community. I also enjoy the mission work we do to help others and if feels good to know the impact we can make not only in our communities, but around the world. My mission group served the organization Human Kind. They help with housing (permanent and temporary) for the homeless and recently released incarcerated. They also help with job placement as well as needed supplies and clothing. While at Human Kind we worked on gardening and landscaping, pulling weeds, removing nuisance trees, planting flowers and laying down gravel. When that was done we helped sort clothing to be passed out to those who need it. Though we were not working directly with those in need it felt good to help with the maintenance tasks so the workers of Human Kind can focus on those who need their services.

Four of the youth were selected to be on a panel where they were asked by church representatives from around the country, "How do we get young people like yourselves to attend church?" Christian and Berlyne from Pilgrim were two of the youth speaking. It was fun to also visit with Mary and other Pilgrim's that attended the adult conference.





Monday Tuesday NAPF/HOPE attendees were split into two groups for mission work. Tim, Berlyne, Dulce & Emmanuel were in the group that served The Lord's Diner which feeds those suffering from homelessness & food insecurities.

By the end they worshiped together, sang together, grieved having to part from their new friends., including the one who thought they weren't going to make any new friends. The way they all came together on the final day was so moving to the adults, we all scrambled for a picture. I felt so blessed to witness the transition from nervous youth from around the country full of insecurity and doubt of what this experience might bring to a new NAPF/HOPE family. It was amazing to watch faith and love grow within each of them as they joined together in service, worship and fellowship. We look forward to coming together again next year for NAPF/HOPE 2023 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Until then, "Carry On a Harvest of Love."
