Blessed

"And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." ~ Luke 14:14

We hear lots of Christians, including ourselves, talk about how "blessed" we are. We usually mean that our families are healthy and happy, that we have good friends and neighbors, a loving and supportive church community, and other positive features of our lives.

I worry a little bit about this kind of talk, which I hear out of my own mouth. I worry that it is one-sided. I think of the Accuser in the book of Job, who says that the only reason Job is righteous is because God has given him so many good things. If God allows these things to be taken away, will Job speak of being blessed by God?

In Luke 14, Jesus speaks of being blessed, not by what you have, but by what you give. If you give to those who cannot possibly repay you, then you are blessed. As usual, Jesus has completely flipped the script of what it means to be blessed. And even after centuries of studying and reflecting on Jesus' words, when church people speak of being blessed, we think almost exclusively of what we have.

I understand that we want to offer thanks to God for all the things that we have. And when we speak of being blessed, we may be simply expressing our gratitude to God for our lives. But we need to remember that being blessed also depends upon giving to those who cannot repay us. Being eternally blessed, in the resurrection of the righteous, means giving without getting anything in return.

It seems very likely that we will continue to speak of being blessed in terms of the life that we enjoy. But I hope that you will pray that we will learn the meaning of "blessed" that Jesus taught. And that remembering this lesson, we will offer ourselves, our services, and our resources to those who have no ability to respond in kind. *And may God bless us, everyone!*

MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR

The Humor of Hope

"And now these three remain: faith, hope and love." ~1 Corinthians 13:13

Last week, I said to Ron, "I hope we make it to the airport on time." The week before that, I said to someone at church, "I hope you feel better." And just a few days ago I laughed when I heard myself say, "I hope you are listening" to one of the grandkids. Next thing I know, I'm reading about NAPF/HOPE, googling the acronym and hearing the word "hope" everywhere. (By the way, for those of you who never knew, the acronym NAPF stands for National Association of Pilgrim Fellowship and HOPE stands for Heritage of Pilgrim Endeavor.)

That started me thinking about that word, hope -- what does it really mean, and what are we saying when we speak it? Nowadays people hope for everything from a new job to a new world. Most of us have used it in a flippant manner, "Oh I sure *hope so*" especially upon hearing an empty promise. We hope for things to end and hope for them to begin. We hope something doesn't happen and then hope for something else to happen, but what is HOPE all about really?

Naturally, I turned to the scripture to try finding answers. God's word talks a lot about hope and even gives application of use to our life. "We rejoice in hope of the glory of God" (Romans 5:2, ESV). Romans 8:24-25, ESV says, "Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience." In Romans 12:12, the Scripture tells us hope brings joy: "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." So the bottom line is a lot of good things come from having hope!

I found it interesting that the ancient Greek word for hope is elpo. The meaning of elpo is to anticipate or welcome – the expectation of what is certain. It is used in the Bible 53 times. Thayer's Greek Lexicon says "that in which one confides or to which he flees for refuge." In other words, it is what you turn to for comfort in life's struggles. We turn to or cling to "hope" to get us through, even though we face pain and loss. That's powerful.

I was recently talking to our own Fay Ellwood about this - well, we were actually lamenting and laughing a little. Just because we believe in God doesn't mean we won't struggle. We are not exempt from trials or life difficulties. Christians suffer, just like everyone else - who knew? The difference for us, as Christians, is we can rely on our faith to bring us hope and endure our struggles by leaning into God's love.

I've been known to discount the application of hope by declaring that "hope" is a poor substitute for a game plan. After all, hope is not a strategy and no one ever reached their goals on hope alone (so I thought.) These are lofty thoughts indeed. I needed to rethink this before I could be comforted in my hopes.

I thought I should do more than just hope. I found humor in the internal struggle of what I can do as opposed to what I should do when it comes to just about all areas of life. In my meditations, I had an epiphany: Along with hope, I needed to step out in faith. It wasn't enough to "hope" my ankle injury would heal... I literally had to take steps of faith and start walking for that healing to begin. Once I fueled my hope with something visible, identifiable and tangible, it seemed more useful. There's a reason the scripture mentions faith, hope and love collectively.

MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR

The pieces came together and I began to comprehend 1 Corinthians 13:13 in a deeply spiritual way. I need faith to create hope and I must rely on God's love to motivate action. Peter describes it perfectly: "Therefore, once you have your minds ready for action and you are thinking clearly, place your hope completely on the grace that will be brought to you when Jesus Christ is revealed." 1 Peter 1:13.

There's no question that we are facing some challenging events in our world, community and church. Unemployment, illness, and social and political unrest plague our society; it makes us wonder if we even have hope for a brighter future? The short answer is a resounding, YES. Our struggles will pass but our eternal hope will endure. Paul even says our struggles are a reason to be happy because we know it produces hope! Let's take a breath and lean into God's mercy and strength as we hope for a new day, an easier path and some relief on the horizon. Collectively, we can continue in infinite hope by focusing on the scriptures and encouraging one another. Let's say, "I hope we can do this" -- and allow that hope to lend it's way to faith -- so then we can say, I "know" we can do this! We can do this by supporting one another, our membership, fellow congregants, clergy and youth. We can literally HOPE and PRAY. We can be happy about our hope and laugh through our tears!

I hope as a Church united we will join our hearts and minds together in faith as we bring our message of love to the world.

Dear Pilgrim Members and Friends,



ROC Season Nineteen




