A Sinner "God be merciful to me, a sinner!" ~ Luke 18:13

October 2022

The word "sin" has a controversial history in the life of the Church. Some Christians seem to want to talk about sin all the time while others go out of their way to avoid discussing it. Part of that history is the unfortunate practice of highlighting certain sins while ignoring others. This is not a new development. Jesus was repeatedly criticized for spending a lot of time with those in his community who were labelled, "sinners," by the religious people of his day. We religious people have a strong tendency to find fault in others while remaining blind to our own faults.

One way that we Christians do this is by identifying a particular sin that we find especially distasteful and elevating it above others. People accused of this sin are grouped together, isolated, and generally reviled and persecuted. Perhaps we think that we can elevate ourselves by putting others down. The result, however, is emotional pain, intense suffering, and unnecessary divisions between people. Jesus did not use the word "sin" to create divisions between people.

I think that we've misunderstood the concept of sin. Sin is not just those things that we do that are wrong, like stealing, lying, and committing adultery. The concept of sin in the Bible also includes the limitations of being human, such as not being able to be in more than one place at a time, not being able to cure everyone that gets sick, and not being able to protect our children from every possible harm. So, sin is also just human limitations that are related to suffering and pain but not anything we could have done to prevent or correct.

But most importantly, the concept of sin is about oneself and one's own relationship to God, not a means for assessing other people's relationships to God. A sinner is not someone else standing before God; a sinner is *me* standing before God. "Sinner" thus does not work as a label for someone else. It only works as a label for me.

As we approach Consecration Sunday, I was inspired to think about a change in my own life. I spent time meditating and contemplating how I can best support God's work to impact our mission. I was motivated to change how I am giving. I realized that "supporting" the church takes many forms -- such as tithing, specific gifts, volunteer work, assistance in programs or even through donations of time and resources to church events. 
FROM THE LIBRARIAN





Leeza York<mark>e</mark> Spends a Musical Month in Italy



During the Summer I had the immense privilege of being apart of International Lyric Academy's 2022 production of Puccini's *Suor Angelica* held in Vicenza, Italy. My month long stay included numerous music and staging rehearsals with the maestro (director), singing alongside a full orchestra, and coaching with the many acclaimed international coaches who were brought in. My mornings consisted of Italian lessons with a fluent speaker, then off to rehearsals which were in the contemporary theatre in Vicenza. During my off days, I was



able to make my way downtown to the heart of Vicenza, taking in the breathtaking views and numerous hiking trails. Downtown was home to picturesque canals and quaint little bookstores where one can find Harry Potter (in Italian) and Italian Grammar for Beginners. Moving further inward you can find the numerous gelato shops that all specialized in unique flavors. One specific gelateria (ice creamery) was prized for their hazelnut and Nutella gelato.



I can contest that it was far beyond the traditional 'chocolate' that Americans are used to. I enjoyed it so much that it became my guilty pleasure every other day! Besides indulging in gelato, I was able to make the 40 minute train ride over to Venezia (Venice)-at least three times during my stay. At first glance, Venice is known for their gondoliers and crowded streets. Regardless of its overpopulation, seeing Venice for the first time is comparable to watching a black and white film-possibly "La Dolce Vita." With the cobble stone laid out in no particular order and its swoon worthy



architecture, the city was Romantic. Overall, I regret nothing-other than not having enough gelato!-and await until Italy calls me back.


CHANGE FOR CHANGE




The Pilgrim Christmas Marketplace has returned! Mark your calendar Sunday, December 4th 11:00am - 2:00 pm.

A MYSTERIOUS PHONE CALL...



A mysterious phone call... from Florida came into Pilgrim's administrative office in mid-September. The caller was a vintage watch shop owner in Tampa Bay, Florida. He had recently acquired a gold-filled watch at an estate sale and wanted to find out information about our church. The watch was a model made during World War I and designed for military service in the trenches, called a 'trench watch.' The watch was inscribed:

"To Rev. William Orr Wark From Pilgrim Congregational Church, Pomona, California"

Office staff provided information about Pilgrim to the caller and then contacted me to try to assist further with the mystery. I dug into our Pilgrim history to prepare myself for the call back to the vintage watch shop owner and sketched out the following:

- William Orr Wark was Pilgrim's fifth Minister, serving from 1915 to 1921.
- Rev. Wark took a Leave of Absence from Pilgrim during WWI and served in the U.S. Army.
- Rev. Wark returned to service at Pilgrim at the war's end, but resigned in 1921 to serve as Director of Pomona's YMCA, and later taught at Pomona College.
- Rev. Wark was born in Canada, was educated in New England colleges and pastored churches in Nebraska, California, and the state of Washington
- Rev, Wark died in 1942 at age 79 and is buried in a Monrovia, California cemetery.

I contacted the Florida watch enthusiast, William Strickland, and learned more about the watch and his plans for it:

- It is a Waltham Massachusetts made watch made close to 1918 with a 'Riverside movement dial' and is a very desirable model. (My grandfather was a watchmaker who happened to work at Waltham Watchmakers during that very period.)
- Mr. Strickland is going to sell the watch and is restoring it to like-new condition and replacing the period watch band.
- In his shop, his vintage watch offerings include a provenance or history of everything he can find about where the watch has been.
- Mr. Strickland took a detour when he started looking at his only clue....
 "Pilgrim Congregational Church, Pomona." He looked up our church and started exploring our history. (See? Websites do pay off!). He got very interested in our connection to Pomona College (I corrected him from "connection to" to "founding") and the breadth of our history.

HISTORIAN'S CORNER CONT.



From the back and forth contacts with church staff, me, websites and internet exploration, Mr. Strickland says he would like to help Pilgrim have first offer on the sale of the watch, or to pass on some type of benefit to Pilgrim from its sale. He stated that he has very strong Christian leanings and is very impressed with our longevity and presence. I take this to mean a possibility of a small monetary contribution from the sale or special pricing and accommodation should the church try to purchase the watch. Of

course, I wanted Mr. Strickland to GIVE the watch to Pilgrim, but I looked up these watches as priced around the country in vintage watch shops and found that they sell from around \$1000 to \$5000. Reality check! So, our question to ourselves is: once we find out his price...

- Is there sentiment for this watch to return to Pilgrim?
- What would we do with it?
- If we really wanted it, should be plan a special fundraiser?
- Is there an antique watch collector or enthusiast in our congregation who would like to own it?
- Does anyone know of any Wark descendants or relatives who may be interested in obtaining it?

I cannot answer any of these questions or speak for anybody, I am just the messenger here, putting the information out for people to think about and offer ideas. How nice it is though, that this spark from over a hundred years ago showed up from the other side of the country and that we are so kindly regarded by this seller who found our staff so helpful and our history so impressive.


