God Reigns

"The Lord is King!" ~Psalm 97:1

This advent season we are giving our attention to the lectionary readings from the Book of Psalms. On first reflection, this may seem like an odd choice. Isn't the advent season about the coming of Christ? What do ancient Hebrew songs and poems have to do with Christmas? Well, Jesus quoted from the Psalms more than any other book, and at the heart of the book itself is the longing expectation of God's reign.

In the last lines of Psalm 96, just before Psalm 97:1, quoted above, we read:

Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy before the LORD; for he is coming, for he is coming to judge the earth.

He will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with his truth.

The life of a religious person is a life lived in a strange, perpetual state of expectation. It is not the sort of expectation that will come and go, like the events of tomorrow and the day after will come and go. It is an expectation that remains throughout one's life, built into the very fabric of one's daily life. It is a way of living in hope when the world offers so many perfectly rational reasons not to hope.

The religious life of expectation, of hope, is not a vague wish about the future or a longing for some imaginary land. It is a life that lives toward hope in every circumstance, grounded in the daily realities that meet us. The Book of Psalms reminds us that God's reign occurs in the real circumstances of life, and that living in hope of that reign means hearing the cries of those in need and of responding to those needs with justice, righteousness, and lovingkindness.

This advent season at Pilgrim Congregational Church, let us commit ourselves to live in the expectation of God's reign in our community. Let us commit to following the way of Christ, listening to those in need, living toward hope, and being determined to meet those needs as best we can.

This verse reminds me that God has always been all-inclusive, with no exceptions, even in the remarkable gift of Christ. A child was born <u>unto us</u>, and God gave <u>us</u>, (the WORLD) his son. We are all God's children and WE are all worthy, entitled and deserving of his love and forgiveness. Isn't it magical that we are united through Christ's birth and in the everlasting grace of God? We don't need a political group, family, ethnic heritage or even a Country because God's love is given freely to ALL of US.

The month of December offers us many wonderful opportunities at Church and in our community to give to the world and to serve OUR community. We can participate in Hand in Hand, Christmas Marketplace, Christmas by Candlelight, the Christmas Dinner and Play, along with our regularly scheduled activities of the morning devotional, Pilgrim Auxiliary, and the Twilight Bible Study.

Please take the opportunity to be part of the many events offered at Pilgrim Church this Season. I invite you to join "me and us" as "we" proclaim the good news in our homes, church and community - A Savior is born and it's more than magic - HE is for ALL OF US!

THE PILGRIM CREW

Last summer, Dr. Horn urged the Board of Trustees to sponsor a proposal for a church growth committee to analyze the growth needs of Pilgrim Church and evaluate the resources available to meet those needs. Earlier this fall, the Trustees brought a proposal to the Church Council, where adjustments and suggestions were amended to the proposal and approved by the Council.

The committee is named **The Pilgrim CREW** - an acronym for **C**ongregationalists, **R**eady, **E**quipped and **W**illing". It is comprised of at least one representative chosen by each Board and co-chaired by the Church Moderator and the Senior Minister. We are excited to announce that The Pilgrim Crew will have its first organizational meeting on Sunday, December 11th at noon in the Conference Room.

The Pilgrim Crew will receive some training on issues in church growth and development. They will also receive reports on meetings with church growth consultants, reviewing and evaluating options for Pilgrim Church. They will meet approximately once a month over the course of the next six months with the goal of bringing proposals for growth to the Church Council and the Boards as deemed appropriate.

In June, the Church Council will evaluate the progress of The Pilgrim Crew. The expectation is that The Crew will continue to meet through 2023 and 2024 while the Boards may rotate representation on The Crew as needed.

We have been building great things for the future of Pilgrim and The Pilgrim Crew is going to make an important contribution to that growth. Stay tuned, as you will be hearing more about this group, and you will be given opportunities for input into the discussions held by The Crew.

Hand in Hand for the Holidays



Hand in Hand for the Holidays has been a part of Pilgrim Congregational Church holiday season for the last 35 years, continuing through the pandemic. It was started by Don & Judy Sanders and was first sponsored by the Diaconate Board. This year our families are from various schools in the Pomona Unified School District and we are working again with Ernie Marquez.

It is wonderful each year to see so many come together to help and we are expanding the ways you can help us serve our nine families.

- Pick up a food list and buy an item on the list. Rising prices have affected everyone, but if
 you just get a box of cereal or bottle of oil or any other item on the list, we'll have enough
 to cover our 9 families quickly. We will get our list out and keep track so keep you can see
 what we still need. All food is due by Sunday, December 18.
- Buy scrip and bring it to the Hand in Hand table. We need Stater Bros, Target, or Walmart
 in \$10 or \$25 cards especially. Some families may have others listed on their wish list.
- Do you have a jacket or gently used clothes, blankets, toys, kitchen items, etc. that you no longer use? We will set up a "store" again this year so families can choose things they can use that might not have been on their list. Bring it in and we will match it up, or add it to our "store".
- If you especially like shopping for toys, check our list and shop for a special toy for one family member. The same is true for clothes. Just let us know what you would like to get. You don't have to cover clothes and gifts for a person. Just tell us what you want to get and we will make sure that they can be adopted for the other.
- You can also give cash, check, or pay through Pushpay and mark your gift for Hand in Hand.
 It's tax deductible and it will allow us to buy gifts for any of our family members who were not adopted.

All food is due on Sunday, December 18

All gifts should be wrapped, tagged with name and family number and brought to the church by Wednesday, December 21. We are distributing on Thursday, December 22.

Christmas meal. We hope many Pilgrims will be joining in on the fun!



Liturgical Notes by Dr. Patrick Horn:

Purple was originally associated with royalty because it was a more expensive color to dye, and it was used to welcome the coming of a king. It also evokes pain and suffering. Purple symbolizes fasting, faith, patience and trust. It is the liturgical color used during the seasons of penance, Advent, and Lent. For Advent, purple symbolizes the impending birth of Jesus while foreshadowing his death.

White symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and thus it was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter.
