"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness-On them light has shined." ~Isaiah 9:2

It is astonishing how the Hebrew language can express contradictions without falling into sheer nonsense. This is the power of poetic language, and the Bible is full of it. In the case of this famous passage from Isaiah, the people who are finite, limited, and sinful have an experience of the infinite, the perfect, and the pure. The message is clear: we, with our severely narrow understanding of life, may mysteriously encounter the limitless source of all. This encounter has been described as walking out into blazing sunlight after spending months or years in darkness.

But while it is the source of light that is venerated and praised, it is what light reveals, what it shines upon, that makes it powerful and valuable to us. One contemporary poet has described it as "the cascading glow of God's mercy." When we turn toward that glow, when we see "a great light," the result is joy and exultation. We see and feel the blazing light of eternity, and we know, without being able to explain how or why, that life will never be the same.

In the glow of that eternal light, we see ourselves and all of creation as both broken by the years of darkness and loved by the powerful light. We do not know what tomorrow will bring or the day after or the years, ahead. But we know that whatever it brings, we will be loved by the Mighty God, the Prince of Peace.

In this new year, let us resolve together to live our faith in this eternal light. No matter what the year brings, we know that true happiness lies in living this faith. Let Pilgrim Congregational Church be a place of renewal and a source of strength for all of us to live this faith. And may the God of light shine upon you and your life throughout the whole year! 


