Choose Life!

"Choose life so that you and your descendants may live." ~Deuteronomy 30:19b

Moses gave his farewell speech to the assembled people as they struggled with exile in the wilderness, confused and discouraged. They had no land of their own and they were constantly harassed by other nations. In the middle of these trying circumstances Moses laid out a clear choice for them: You can choose either life and prosperity or death and adversity.

It seems like such an easy choice. But why is it that when we are burdened by trials and sorrows it is so difficult to choose life? Hardship and poor choices seem to breed more hardship and poor choices in an endless cycle. How do we break the cycle? Moses said: choose life by loving God, obeying God, and holding fast to God.

Choose life! The words are easy to say. But choosing life is apparently much more difficult to do than to say. Choosing life is a way of working on oneself. Loving God and obeying God and holding fast to God have to do with developing one's heart, mind, and soul, positioning oneself toward the things of God. Choosing life, ironically, means putting oneself in a position that eliminates choices. Just love God.

Again, easy words. How do we do it? A flash in the pan would do us no good. Choosing life has to be sustainable, something that keeps going. For me, it's always been about engagement: a determination to stay engaged with the community, with the tradition, with God. Keep praying. Keep reading the Bible. Keep worshiping. Keep serving. Keep being vulnerable to change and growth and love.

Choosing life involves a kind of persistence and patience. The persistence part seems obvious, if not always easy. But this is where the patience comes in, patience with others, patience with oneself, and perhaps even a sort of patience with God, that is, a willingness to work through what life brings. Choose life but don't be fooled into thinking it's a one off; choosing life then is choosing to live in patience.



RECYCLING FOR EDUCATION



As you likely already know, Pilgrim Youth collect recyclables year round which are donated to ROP-MERCY Foundation. The ROP-MERCY Foundation, led by founder Rachel Rop who turns uses the profit from the recyclables to pay the educational fees for students to attend high school through graduation. This project has a special place in our heart as it serves those in need and it also serves to protect and honor Earth, the home we share with all of our neighbors near and far.

I recently received a message from Rachel meant for the members of Pilgrim Congregational Church:

"Thank you so much Sarah and the entire congregational church for your support of the needy children in Kenya. Through your generous donation of your recyclables, on January 23rd we sent the following students (see picture) to boarding schools with fees paid for the whole year. We would not have been able to do so without the support of Pilgrim Congregational Church. May God Bless you for all you do."

I remember when we began this project Rachel told me that they were only able to help one or two students at a time to ensure that they were able to complete their four years of high school. I am excited to see that the ROP-MERCY Foundation is able to support even more. So please keep turning in your recyclables. So keep saving your soda cans, water bottles and anything that has a CRV label on it and turn them in on Sundays. Rachel counts out each recyclable to get the best price for the recycled items. For this reason please rinse out what you can and place in large trash bags that can be tied shut. Also, be sure to not mix trash in with the recyclables.





As mentioned before, we love that this project is also good for our Earth as it provides education to those who will soon be in charge of our Earth's future and helps to protect Earth as we learn to reduce, reuse and recycle. In honor of our on going project and Earth day coming up in April, Rachel and I are working on a field trip for the youth, though any are welcome to join us, that will include going through the process with Rachel that she goes through turning in the recyclables as well as a possible tour of a recycling plant. More details on this will be coming soon. Another Earth Day event coming up will be The Blessing of the Animals on Saturday, April 22nd.

Most likely know that the Tournament of Roses is an event that many in Southern California and throughout the country look forward to in welcoming a new year. However, what you may not know is Pilgrim's special connection to the annual spectacular. Many of our members participate in parade as designers, decorators, drivers and more.

Mr. Jon Olson has driven parade floats for many years and now serves as a chauffeur for float drivers including his son Mr. Andrew Olson. This year Andrew drove the Bazic School Supplies float. To give you an ideas, each float takes at least 2 controllers with only one being able to see outside, providing instructions to the one operating the throttle and steering wheel. These drivers work a 20 hour shift in all weather which is typically cold and sometimes wet.

Christian, Stephen, Jaylah and **Stephen** helped to decorate the Rotarian Float as a Service project with BSA Venturing Crew 301. They crawled and climbed around the structure covering every inch of the float in flowers. In the picture below you will see Samie wedged in a precarious position trying to get the flowers into crevices and corners. It can take, on average, 100s of hours to decorate a float.

Stephen also worked on the Cal Poly float as a student of the schools Engineering Department. He helped with the design, building the structure and decorating with flowers. The designing and construction of a float can take thousands of hours over many months.

Though each participated in the Rose Parade with various reasons and organizations we are proud as Pilgrims' of our Pilgrim family. As an added bonus, every float they worked on won a prize. The Rotary Float won the Princess Trophy for most outstanding floral presentation among entries 35 feet and under in length. The Bazic School Supply float earned the Crown City Innovator Award for most outstanding use of imagination, innovation and technology. The Cal Poly float earned the Extraordinaire Award for the most extraordinary float.

Liturgical Notes by Dr. Patrick Horn:

Green symbolizes growth and life, hope and anticipation. Green is used in Ordinary time, the period of the Church calendar which gives attention to the Lord's life and ministry; it reminds us that the mission of the Church is to love the world and share the hope

of Christ.

White symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and thus it was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter.

Purple was originally associated with royalty because it was a more expensive color to dye, and it was used to welcome the coming of a king. It also evokes pain and suffering. Purple symbolizes fasting, faith, patience and trust. It is the liturgical color used during the seasons of penance, Advent, and Lent. For Advent, purple symbolizes the impending birth of Jesus while foreshadowing his death.
