

Live in Love

"Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us." ~Ephesians 5:1-2

The book of Ephesians speaks of a particular kind of love. The kind of love discussed here may not make a lot of sense in our day and time. Perhaps it has never made a lot of sense. It is the sacrificial love represented by Jesus' death on the cross.

Most of us would probably rather reflect on Jesus' life and teachings or on the part of the story that says he was raised by God to Eternal Life in the resurrection. The idea of sacrificial love runs into the ordinary problem of whether we are taking good care of ourselves, and it hits a stone wall when it encounters the modern notion of the self. Sacrificing or denying the self seems like utter nonsense by that standard.

The theological challenge is that I don't know how to speak of God's love for us without talking about this sacrificial love. Ephesians asks us to reflect upon it. Not only are we to contemplate God's sacrificial love for us but we are asked to live that kind of love in relation to others. What is this love, and what does it look like?

One clue in Ephesians is its attention to forgiveness. The writer explains that God's love for us is characterized by God's merciful forgiveness. We are to forgive others in this same way. And, forgiving others is a kind of sacrifice of the self—letting go of a righteous claim of wrongdoing charged against another.

There is no love quite like a love that unconditionally accepts a person as they are with all their weaknesses and all their past wrongdoings. This is how God loves us. This is how we are to love the world, the same way that God loves the world.

So, when we are personally wronged by someone or hear about someone who has done something awful, imagine what it would be like to love that person, like God.

MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR

The Lord is good to all, and his mercy is over all that he has made.

(Ps. 145:9 ESV)



This March, remember that God has shown us mercy in His Son, Jesus Christ, and that mercy frees us to care for others — to acknowledge, value, listen to, forgive, have compassion on, speak up for and love!

One of the Gospel lessons for Epiphany gives us a clear picture of what it means to be "fishers of men."

Matthew reports that shortly after Jesus began His public ministry, He called to Peter and Andrew as they were fishing: "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Shortly afterward, He also called James and John. Then He went throughout all of Galilee, teaching in synagogues, preaching the Gospel and healing people of all sorts of diseases and afflictions. News of what Jesus was doing reached the Gentiles in Syria, which was hundreds of miles away, yet they came. They came because they needed the mercy of God. Even though the Syrians had held Israel in disdain for hundreds of years, they humbled themselves because they were desperate to be healed. And when they arrived, the received the compassion of Jesus.

Entering the season of Lent reminds us all to continue our personal path and church ministry that includes sharing the mercy and compassion of Christ. We have so many opportunities in our community, church, home and congregation to lead the example of being fishers of men, spreading joy, hope and the good news.

We are so grateful for our church programs and groups giving ministry to us all. In the coming months, lets band together to support our youth, the staff, our Boards and leadership. We are also so grateful for the many events connected to our Season of Lent including the Walk with Jesus on March 4, 2023 (along with so many more.) Be sure to check out the Pilgrim's Progress for the calendar of upcoming events. Mark the dates for Blessing of the Animals on April 22, Rummage on April 29, church-wide Bingo on May 6, CE Sunday & Banquet on May 21, and Music Sunday on June 4th.

Finally, please continue to pray for one another as we embark on a new Spring Season on Monday, March 20, 2023 and our Easter Season, as we remain;

LIBRARY NEWS





In Your name, I pray. Amen.



A Big Accomplishment for a Little Guy.







HISTORIAN CORNER

EXCERPTS FROM A PILGRIM LETTER FROM THE 1800'S

The following is taken from a 2011 Historian Report I presented to Church Council. The letter was written in the late 1800's by a member of the St.Clair/Shedd family and is quite amazing and worthy of reprinting.


"My first visit to Pomona was in December of 1883. It chanced to be a Wednesday evening and the church bell led me down to the corner of Third and Gordon Streets, where a prayer meeting was being held in the little Methodist Church, the only church in Pomona at this time. There were, however, plenty of saloons. Other churches soon followed, and we attended many different ones, but none of them became a church home.

Early in 1887, God sent to us a man of vision, Rev. C. B Sumner, who was able to look out across the sagebrush and cactus, and see a valley full of orchards and homes. He was able to "see" Pomona College and Pilgrim Church. It took the faith and the courage of the Pilgrim Fathers in those early days. With no building of our own, we held our services in the Opera House on the northwest corner of Third and Thomas Streets.

Very soon after the organization of Pilgrim Church in 1887, our energetic pastor had us working for a building of our own. Lots on the southeast corner of Third and Thomas were secured, and before Thanksgiving Day, the new chapel was ready for use. Our first Sunday service was held there November 27, 1887. The cost of the house and grounds was about \$7600. We finished paying for this in 1890. By 1893, the congregation had increased to such an extent it became necessary to enlarge the building. This was accomplished by cutting the building in two, separating the two parts, and building in between.

After leading us so splendidly through 1888, Dr. Sumner left us for the call of Pomona College. I can only mention briefly the very helpful and inspiring pastorates of Mr. Frary, Mr. Soper, and Mr. Davis. All these early pastors taught us to serve and to be generous in our giving.

The Annual Meetings were always harmonious, with a feast for body and soul. Every year the ties of fellowship and love grew stronger and our church home more dear."



Liturgical Notes by Dr. Patrick Horn:

Purple was originally associated with royalty because it was a more expensive color to dye, and it was used to welcome the coming of a king. It also evokes pain and suffering. Purple symbolizes fasting, faith, patience and trust. It is the liturgical color used during the seasons of penance, Advent, and Lent. For Advent, purple symbolizes the impending birth of Jesus while foreshadowing his death.
