Humility Under God

**“Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God,
so that He may exalt you in due time.”**

~1 Peter 5:6

It's very hard to teach humility. When you consider this verse from the First Epistle of Peter, it is tempting to think, “Oh, I need to be humble so I can be exalted by God.” A desire for spiritual and religious achievements can be as damaging as any other human desire. And the fact that God exalts the humble can become a destructive source of pride. So, how do we teach people in our community and ourselves to be humble?

The first thing to remember, I think, is that God exalts the humble in their humility. So, it is the very life of humility that is exalted, not something the individual receives *after* being humble. It is the way of humility that is exalted. Whatever praise or recognition that you receive for your humble service, after the fact, has little or nothing to do with humility.

The second helpful reminder is that humility is ultimately rooted in one's relationship to God. Contrary to popular conception, humility does not rest on comparisons of ourselves with others. Humility begins with the recognition of who we are as we stand before God. That God is perfect love, and we are not, ought to be sufficiently humbling. This recognition comes through the practices of the church community: worship, prayer, and service to others.

Finally, I find that the greatest teacher of humility is Mystery. We ought not to avoid Mystery. Learning to embrace the Mystery of existence is nearly the same as learning humility. We should not be afraid to admit how little we know; how little we can explain of life and its winding path. This is not anti-intellectualism or anti-science. On the contrary, admitting and accepting one's ignorance is intellectual truth, embracing Mystery, the source of great poetry, literature, art, and music.

Humility then is learned through the richness of life's experiences mediated through the arts and the practices of our church community. See you in church!

MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR



We Already Did That!

We recently had internet problems at home. The long and dreadful call to our provider was inevitable and I was happily surprised when I reached a guy named Tom in Missouri. I explained the problem to Tom and we began the long and exhausting process of trouble-shooting. Every time he assigned me a task, I said, "I already did that, yep, we already tried that, and yes, we did that!" About halfway through the process, Tom said "Go ahead and power down your modem." And now I was adamant - "I ALREADY DID THAT!! But, OK, if you say so, I will do it...again!" Behold, this was the trick and all things internet and Wi-Fi were restored! Nothing short of a miracle.

This internet event reminded me of how stubborn we can be in the face of challenges. Every time I read book of Luke, I am fascinated by the interaction between Christ and his disciples, and particularly with respect to Luke Chapter 5, verses 4-11. After a very long day, Jesus tells the disciples to [again] put their nets out into the deep water. Simon answers by saying, "We toiled ALL night and we took nothing." I always wonder what Simon was really thinking when he said, "Yes, we already did that. But if you say so, I'll do it again" (maybe to prove you wrong?). So Simon Peter carried out the task (maybe even begrudgingly) and then a true miracle occurred and their nets were so full of fish they were near breaking.

If we are being honest, in my mind, I wonder if Simon was thinking to himself - "we are so tired, we've been fishing all day, we are experts and I know there are no more fish, we already DID THAT, and why is this guy pressing us to go out AGAIN!" In fact he says, "Master, already we worked hard all night" (been there/done that!). But in obedience, Simon Peter carried out the task and was blessed beyond measure. Then naturally he felt guilty for even doubting Jesus.

When God gently prods us or even directly commands us, I wonder how many times we say, "I did that already [and it didn't work] - I've been trying and nothing happened." Do we obey and try again, or are we convinced of the outcome? Do we hold onto to our own "expert" opinions about church, our life, our beliefs and or families? What might have happened if the disciples refused to carry out the task?

I ask myself questions like this when it comes to matters of the church and my own spiritual journey. When I hear ideas proposed at Pilgrim, many times we automatically respond by saying, "We already did that, we already tried that, we've been working hard for a long time and nothing has happened -- why in the world would we try again?" The answer is that God's abundant grace and glorious power will work in our lives as we continue to charge ahead in faith.

Let us be reminded to keep on keeping on - to answer the call of Jesus to be fishers of men, never give up, try again and always have resilient faith. As we embark upon a new church year in June, let us remember never to be so sure of our past failures that we forsake our future attempts. As we answer the call of God, our lives will become full we are overflowing. Let us go out deep - in the community, our church and our world, and let down nets AGAIN, as we remain:

"Steadfast and immovable always abounding in the work of the Lord!"



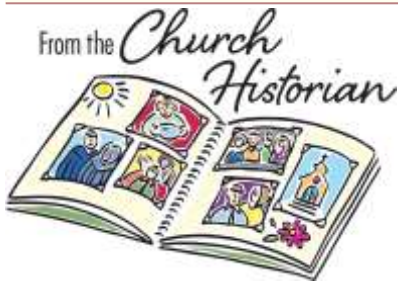

The Long, Interesting & Admirable History of the Women of Pilgrim Church

The Womens' Mission and Auxiliary groups started at Pilgrim Church well before the women in this country were allowed to vote (1920).

The first record of a "Womens' Organization" at Pilgrim is dated 1887, at which time the women of the church organized and formed a "society" dedicated to the furtherance of the church and for charity. It was known at the time as the "Women's Organization." The focus evolved to support the missionary work of the church and renamed itself the Women's Missionary Union.

In 1889, the organization changed its name to the "Womens' Working Chapter" and took on fundraising activities to support the church choir and the furnishings of the church. "Any lady could join" the organization by paying an entry fee of 25 cents and monthly dues of 10 cents per month.

Over the years, the Womens' Organization formed a reception committee to welcome new church members and new ministers, provided flowers for church services, decorated the church and its parlors, purchased six dozen silver-plated spoons (75 cents per dozen), and plates and dishes for fellowship dinners.

In 1890, \$133.00 was raised and sent in support of the "Leper Fund."

In 1906, the Womens' group raised funds for the earthquake victims of the San Francisco Earthquake.

Some of the funds raised by the women involved sewing projects and a church sewing machine was purchased for \$35.00. Pilgrim Women rolled bandages and sewed to assist the Red Cross during World War I (1914-1918).

Local causes were also addressed by Pilgrim Women. In May 1910, the church women determined that the City of Pomona, which had established a zoo exhibition at Ganesha Park which exhibited caged wild animals, was being managed with inhumane treatment of the animals. The Pilgrim group, in true Congregational form, met on the issue, voted, and adopted a resolution of concern for cruelty to animals, and challenged the City, bringing about the closure of the caged animal exhibits.

In 1912, a fledgling rummage sale was held, several years later to become a city, then a regional institution.

HISTORIAN'S CORNER CONTINUED

In 1917, the WOMENS AUXILIARY OF PILGRIM CHURCH was formed, and Mrs. William (Laura) Hand (creator of the needlepoint chairs in the parlor) was the first president. With the forming of the Auxiliary, 12 womens' guilds were established, all in support of the goals of the church and in service to the community. A notation in a set of 1923 Auxiliary Minutes mentions what may be the first of what would later become the "Wednesday Night Dinners."

In 1923, with a \$1.00 donation from Maria Eells, the Pilgrim Church echo organ fund came into being, with the purchase and installation made following the church fire of 1925.

Over the decades, the various women's support groups have contributed to the growth, development, reputation and effectiveness of Pilgrim's relevance to the community surrounding it.

We know much of what Pilgrim did and how they did it through the legacy of written records left by the women's groups through ledgers, Guild Minutes, scrapbooks, photographs and other records.

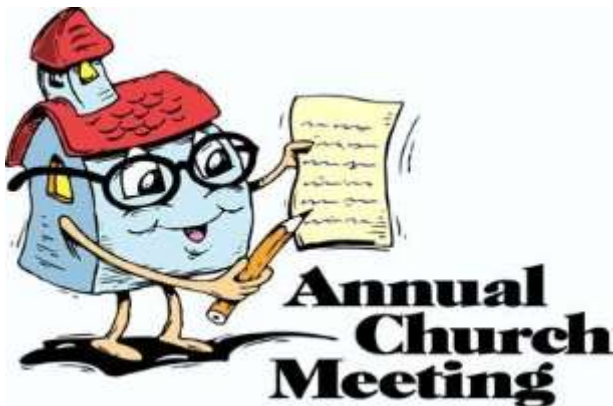

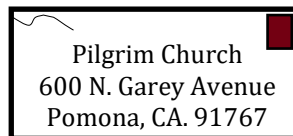

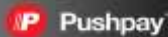
