# A World in Need, Needs Compassion

"Like sheep without a shepherd." -Matthew 9:36

When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.

Matthew 9:36

The gospel of Matthew says that when Jesus looked upon the crowds that gathered to hear him and to watch him perform miracles, he was moved with compassion for them, "because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." Jesus saw the need of the world.

For all its differences with 1<sup>st</sup> century Palestine, our world is similar in its deep need. We enjoy centuries of technological advances in medicine, healthcare, and engineering that have dramatically improved the quality of life for people in every corner of the world.

And yet, even in those communities, like our own, in which we have access to the highest available standards of living, people are still desperately lonely, children and teenagers are beset with psychological challenges that seem connected to technological advances, and political battles over cultural issues divide us from one another.

Ours is a world in deep need. Our response must be the response that Jesus gave: compassion. We must respond to this need with care and concern, a sacrificial love for those without a shepherd. We have the community to do this. We have committed ourselves to worship, to pray, and to serve. This is how the kingdom of heaven comes near to those in need. We offer our community and open our hearts to anyone who seeks the kingdom of heaven.

Church attendance and involvement continues to decline in the United States. There are many reasons for this, but one reason people lost interest in churches is that churches became too focused on things other than compassion for those in need. A church can bring the kingdom of heaven near to those in need if its focus is compassion.

Pilgrim Congregational Church does not have all the answers. Would such a claim even make sense? But in following Jesus Christ, we know that our focus must be compassion for those in need. And we know that we can do this best through worship, prayer, and service. We know what a world in need, needs.

Come and learn how we do the work of the Church at Pilgrim Congregational Church.


# LIBRARY NEWS





# VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL NEEDS YOU!

# we can't do it without you!

This year we are trying something new. Instead of a week long VBS, we will be holding 3 VBS sessions over 3 Sunday afternoons so that those who work during the week or have to attend summer school can participate. We hope to have 40 children across 4 different age groups (10 kids per group) and predict we will need a team of at least 20 - 25 volunteers each Sunday. *Sounds like fun, but you're not available all 3 Sundays?* If you can only do 1 or 2 Sundays, that is okay, we will work to have a full team each Sunday, but that doesn't mean it has to be the same volunteers, depending on the assign-




# **HISTORIAN'S REPORT**



# Pilgrim Trivia Did you know...?

- In 1980, a 25-bell carillon system was installed in the Pilgrim Bell Tower. It replaced the 1926 Tower Chime System. The chimes were heard through loudspeakers in the tower and organ chambers. They could be played automatically or from a keyboard next to the organ console.
- \* In 2012, the carillon system was upgraded to an electronic system. The chimes were programmed to be heard in the immediate church neighborhood.
- In 2011, the South stained glass sanctuary window was restored through re-leading glass restoration and re-installation of the window. This was a one-year project requiring painstaking removal and transport piece by piece. The pieces were brought to Judson Glass Studios in Pasadena (descended from the original window creators generations earlier.) While the windows were being restored and the lead work re-done, Pilgrims were allowed to tour the glassworks studio and watch the work as it was being done. The huge window was returned to Pomona and re-installed in a braced and reinforced frame.
- \* Prior to 1985, the entire and massive Pilgrim sanctuary was heated via two furnace duct vent openings, located alongside the organ pipes at the front of the sanctuary. The enormous gas furnace system was located in the church basement. The furnace was replaced in 1985 upon recommendation of the Fire Department. Air conditioning was installed at the same time.
- \* The style of Pilgrim's architecture is "Early English Gothic of the 12th century."
- Pilgrim's Women's' Auxiliary members divided into ten smaller service groups called guilds. The guilds adopted Pilgrim-themed names: Charity, Harmony, Mayflower, Patience, Loyal, Pilgrim, Plymouth, Priscilla, Prudence and Purity.



#### Liturgical Notes by Rev. Dr. Patrick Horn -

**White** symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter.

**Green** symbolizes growth and life, hope and anticipation. Green is used in Ordinary time, the period of the Church calendar which gives attention to the Lord's life and ministry; it reminds us that the mission of the Church is to love the world and share the hope of Christ.
