MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

A Blessed People

"... they are a people whom the Lord has blessed." – Isaiah 61:9

There are a multitude of ways in which Pilgrim Congregational Church is a blessed people. We are a fellowship of hope and faith, of service and love, of prayer and worship. We have financial resources for services to the community and educational programs for spiritual development. We fervently support, with prayer and service, the sick and disabled in our communities. We enjoy the fruit of all these ways of being church. It certainly feels as if our church fellowship is blessed.

You may recall that Jesus spoke frequently about what it means to be blessed. He provided a whole list of blessings in the Sermon on the Mount called the Beatitudes. He also told stories which emphasized that we are blessed when we give to those in severest need without expecting anything in return. Pilgrim Church is certainly blessed in this way, too, since we give to our communities without expectation of repayment, gifts freely given in the spirit of joy.

We can see that Jesus was a devoted student of the message in Isaiah since his message so closely aligns with what we read in Isaiah 61. In this passage, a blessed people is a people whose righteousness and praise "springs up before all the nations." Ancient Israel is described as blessed because they are characterized by their works of righteousness and the salvation which is theirs in the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

In the coming year, Pilgrim Congregational Church will have more and more opportunities to be a blessed people. We will be faced with new beginnings and unique occasions to give to one another and to those in our community who are in need. The Advent and Christmas Season is a season of renewing this message of blessedness, of lifting up the lowly and filling up the hungry with good things. And if we respond in loving submission to this message, Pilgrim Church, like Ancient Israel and Mary, the Mother of Jesus, will be called blessed from generation to generation.

Don Sanders attended adult camp at Cedar Lake with wife Judy, who is standing in the back with other Pilgrim friends.

Don Sanders joined Pilgrim in January 1977. He had been involved in the young adult program at Union Congregational Church in Angel's Camp so he looked for another Congregational church when he moved to Southern California. Here at Pilgrim he has served on the Christian Education Board, the Outreach Board and the Board of Trustees and as Sunday School Superintendent, Sunday School teacher and Moderator (1989.)

Now retired, Don taught high school science. After attending San Jose State College Don took science classes in Texas. He started his career in Crockett in the bay area, moving to Southern California to work at the new San Dimas high school which opened in 1970. His hobbies include gardening, travelling and cooking. (Pilgrim has often benefitted from his culinary skills, including lunches, Christmas cookies and the rummage bake sale!) He is the oldest of seven children. The family began in Minnesota and came to Ponderosa for the logging industry, then to Calaveras.

Here at Pilgrim Don met Judy and her son Bob in 1978. They were married in 1980 and son Brian was born in 1982. Their son Bob has four daughters, Daphne, Sophia, Sadie and Stella, all baptized at Pilgrim as was Brian's son Leigh.

When asked what Pilgrim means to him his answer was: "Pilgrim is important because of religious support, friendly membership, and the place where I met Judy".

SPOTLIGHT ON MUSIC



Susan loves working with her church choir and playing the beautiful 4 manual pipe organ at Pilgrim Congregational Church, [Pomona.] She finds church musicians to be exceptionally loyal, and says both conducting and playing the organ are *'inspiring and religious'* experiences. 

Liturgical Notes by Rev. Dr. Patrick Horn:

Purple was originally associated with royalty because it was a more expensive color to dye, and it was used to welcome the coming of a king. It also evokes pain and suffering. Purple symbolizes fasting, faith, patience, and trust. It is the liturgical color used during the seasons of penance, Advent, and Lent. For Advent, purple symbolizes the impending birth of Jesus while foreshadowing his death.

White symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter.
