

MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Life is Strange

"whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live." Numbers 21:7

When I was a child, our family had one of those large family Bibles containing paintings that dramatically portrayed scenes from the text. One of the most striking and unforgettable pictures was of the story of the bronze serpent from the book of Numbers. I will never forget the spectacular image of snakes wrapped around writhing bodies whose faces were lifted to a bronze serpent on a pole in their midst. It was a very strange picture of one of the strangest stories in the Bible.

The story starts innocently enough. The ancient Hebrews in the wilderness are tired, thirsty, hungry, and angry because Moses is intentionally leading them on a circuitous route to avoid confrontation with the Edomites. They bitterly complain and the text says that the Lord sends poisonous snakes to attack them in response to their grievances. The people quickly repent, and the Lord tells Moses to make a bronze serpent on a pole, set it in their midst, and whoever looks up at the bronze serpent will be saved.



Preachers and poets try to find strong, pithy statements that will convey grand and universal messages. And there are some great ones. Wallace Stevens wrote, "Death is the mother of beauty." And Marianne Moore penned, "Hope is not hope until all ground for hope has vanished." Czech poet Miroslav Holub wrote, "You only love when you love in vain." The problem is that these grand statements are cold and meaningless in the abstract. They require the tough and gritty context of life to hold the breadth and depth of their meaning.

Stories like the one of the bronze serpent help us to value the gritty strangeness of life, an appreciation needed in order to grasp what is grand and universal about life. Similarly, we cannot adequately grasp the wonder and magnitude of the resurrection without valuing the suffering and despair of the cross. As Easter approaches, in this time of Lent, embrace the strangeness of life.






Movie Day!





The colorful Easter Lilies and Azaleas beautifying our Sanctuary this morning have been dedicated by our Pilgrim Church Members and Friends.

Boutonnieres for **March** are provided "To the glory of God for His gift of eternal life in our risen Lord,"

Liturgical Notes by Rev. Dr. Patrick Horn:

Purple was originally associated with royalty because it was a more expensive color to dye, and it was used to welcome the coming of a king. It also evokes pain and suffering. Purple symbolizes fasting, faith, patience, and trust. It is the liturgical color used during the seasons of penance, Advent, and Lent. For Advent, purple symbolizes the impending birth of Jesus while foreshadowing his death.

White symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany & Easter.


