MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

The Ennobling of Human Life

“It is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God.”

~Romans 8:16



It is truly one of the great ironies of Christian history that St. Paul is credited (or charged) with the idea that human nature is fallen and innately sinful because of Adam. Paul went out of his way to repeat over and over again that human beings are capable of walking according to spirit. There is nothing about being human that precludes a person from living in the Spirit of God, that is, from having the Spirit of Christ.

For Paul, we are spiritual creatures, made in the image of God. We are also bodily (material) creatures with free wills; we can choose to live as if the material is the ultimate meaning of life. Thus, we can live in Christ, that is, according to spirit, or we can live according to the material. Paul does **NOT** say that we are innately material and in need of a change in our makeup as human beings.

Now, of course, Paul acknowledges that human beings are capable of all sorts of evil and cruelty. But this is only because we choose to live this way. According to Paul, Jesus Christ reveals what human beings are created to be and those who live in Christ become new persons. The newness here is not a new and different kind of creature; the newness contrasts with the old way of living according to the material. This new way of living in Christ builds relationships of goodness and justice and love.

Paul hammers home this point with the statement from Romans 8: “It is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God.” It is in our relationships with one another and with Creation that we demonstrate that we are children of God. Paul thus teaches that the human capacity to be in a relationship serves as the proving ground for God’s Spirit. As in the teachings of Christ, attention to things of the spirit ennobles human life.

Pilgrim Congregational Church for supporting the Youth Lent Project 2024!
This year's Lent Project was to support the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.

We had fun learning along the way what Cystic Fibrosis is and how it effects children just like us. We learned about CF at a special dinner, watched a movie (5 Feet Apart) that demonstrated the challenges CF patients face with their relationships as well as health. We enjoyed a visit from Quinn (a CF patient) and her mother who shared with us their CF experience. We also enjoyed a delicious drink from Quinn's Lemonade stand. We participated in a hands on project for children hospitalized with CF and had a campaign to raise money for the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation to continue to do research that will lead to extending the life of CF patients. CF was once considered a childhood disease as many did not live to see adulthood. Thanks to the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation and donors like you, the average life expectancy is in the 50s. Now this is of course not long enough and they continue to work towards a cure. We would like to announce that through the support of Pilgrim Congregational Church members and friends, **the youth put together 20 care boxes for CF patients** going through medical treatments at Miller Children's & Women's Cystic Fibrosis Center. **The 65 Roses Campaign raised \$724.50 dollars to go directly to the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation for research. The total collected for the Youth Lent Project was \$1,031 to benefit the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. THANK YOU!!!** Thank you also to Karli Tanner for serving as Liaison between Pilgrim and the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation and helping to provide an educational and rewarding opportunity to serve our community.

Miller Children's & Women's Cystic Fibrosis Center is one of the largest in the region and provides comprehensive, multidisciplinary care including evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment for children from birth to age 21, with cystic fibrosis (CF). The Center offers diagnostic testing, such as sweat tests, genetic tests, throat cultures, sputum cultures, blood work and chest x-rays. Miller Children's

& Women has the largest number of ongoing active CF clinical trials available to patients in Southern California. The continued research efforts of the CF care team plays a vital role in enhancing patient care and developing more effective medical treatments and diagnostic tools. The Center is accredited by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation and follows the clinical guidelines set forth by the foundation to offer the best care, treatments and support for those with CF.

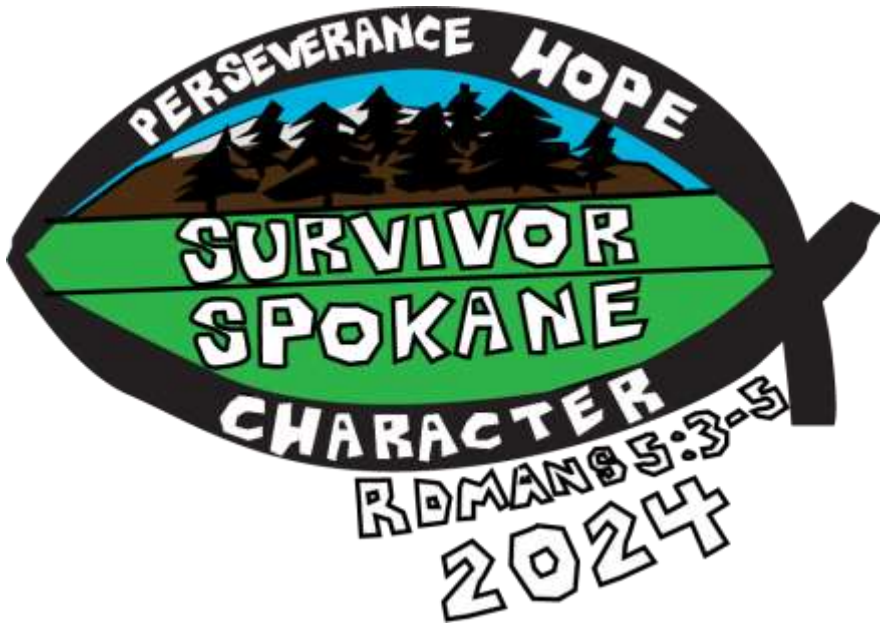

White symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany & Easter.

Red is the color of sacrifice and is used during Palm Sunday, Holy Week, Pentecost, and the feasts of the apostles and the martyrs.

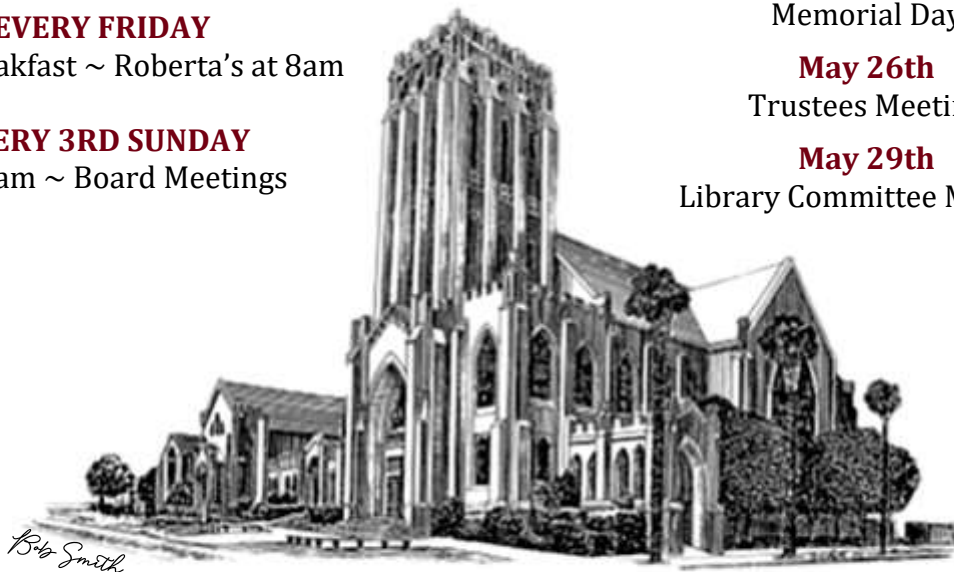
