MESSAGE FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

Out of the Whirlwind

Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind ~ Job 38:1

Our lives resemble a whirlwind. We live in the midst of chaotic forces. The dust blinds us not only to our surroundings, but also to the past and the future. We are uncertain as to whether we should move forward or go back, frozen in indecision, unable to see or read the windsock and thus seemingly without direction.

And, yet, out of the whirlwind the Lord answers us. We have forgotten this truth, and so we don't hear and thus we can't see. We keep trying to find some joy that we can grasp with our hands, but it always slips away. We keep thinking that if we try a little harder, we will figure things out. We forget that the Lord answers us from the whirlwind.

What does the Lord say? "Why do you muddle things? Why do you think that you can understand things that are obviously beyond your understanding? Did you bring the universe into being? Did you determine its characteristics and features? Were you there in the beginning?"

The Lord has more questions. "Does lightning and thunder come from you? Where do you think human knowledge and consciousness come from? From *you*? You don't even know where water comes from, not to mention animal life and its complex systems of support."



The joy we seek lies in the Lord's answer from the whirlwind, not in our understanding or our effort. It lies in a life that is faithful to our Creator. We are surrounded by extraordinary beauty and astounding features of life. Love and goodness and justice have already been given to us to enjoy. We need only embrace what lies before us.

The Lord answers us out of the whirlwind. We need only to listen and then we will see. Joy is ours, already. Our burden is light. Our path is straight. Let us walk in the path of faithfulness, refusing to be anxious. Instead, let us listen to the Lord and embrace the joy that surrounds our lives.

MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR



In his presentations to the NACCC, Alan Roxburgh, explained that decreasing church attendance and the exodus of young people from the church is related to a crisis in the larger Western culture. The story we have lived by (With superior technical knowledge and hard work, we will succeed.) has come unraveled. In the wider culture, people are less certain that higher education and hard work will make a difference.

Before he would say what we should do, Roxburgh pointed us to our foundational stories in the Bible to understand how the Israelites and the early Christians found God at work when their stories came unraveled (With proper worship at the Temple and a faithful descendant of David on the throne, Israel will be successful.) with the destruction of the Temple and Jerusalem by the Babylonians and the destruction of Jerusalem and the Second Temple by the Romans shortly after the time of Jesus. He pointed us to Jeremiah's letter to the Babylonian exiles in Jeremiah 29, and to Luke-Acts in the New Testament.

Roxburgh says the answers to the church's crisis will not be found in the "Ivory Towers" of educational institutions or denominational leaders. The programs and ideas that have worked for the church in the past no longer work as well as in the past. There were those in Judea and among the exiles who were focused on returning to Jerusalem and rebuilding the temple, and after Jesus' resurrection and return to heaven, the apostles stayed in Jerusalem and frequently visited the temple. Roxburgh said that the answers today will be found by believers "on the ground" in their communities, and instead of a prepackaged program, he suggested "practices" for believers. These practices are "Dwelling," "Discerning," and "Experimentation."

To explain what he means by "Dwelling" he again pointed to the letter of Jeremiah to the exiles:

"To Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons and give your daughters in marriage that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there and do not decrease. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare." ~ Jerimiah 29:5-7

He also pointed to the instructions Jesus gave the twelve apostles when he sent them out to "proclaim the kingdom of God" (Luke 9:2): "He said to them, 'Take nothing for your journey, no staff, nor bag, nor bread, nor money—not even an extra tunic. Whatever house you enter, stay there, and leave from there'." (Luke 9:3-4).

"Dwelling" for Roxburgh is becoming part of the local community. According to the custom of the time and culture of Jesus and his followers, people would offer hospitality to travelers in their home. Jesus wanted the twelve to accept the hospitality offered, and join in the life and work of the extended family that hosted them. They were not to go from house to house looking for the best cook and softest bed. They were to eat what the people ate and join in their lives and experience. Luke tells us, "They departed and went through the villages, bringing the good news and curing diseases everywhere." (Luke 9:6)

To "dwell" and become part of his community, Roxburgh sold his car. He says his coffeeshop is the one he can walk to. He does woodworking in his garage, and it has become a gathering place for his neighbors. He is coming to know his community and be known. When people sit at table together, they talk about their lives and what is important to them. When we are attempting to dwell in our community and get to know the people we need to listen to understand, and not just listen with a view to how we will respond.




FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

You can get diagram templates and event request forms from the church office by request. You may have given this information in passing to one of the staff, however, it is likely they were

between one task and another and in the hustle details may get lost. If we receive an email any lost details will be covered and we can be sure to have everything you need ready for you. 


