# MESSAGE FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

# **Generosity**

"She out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on." ~ Mark 12-44

The best-known story of generosity in all of the New Testament is the story of the widow and her two mites. According to the Gospel of Mark, people were lining up to make their contributions to the treasury of the Temple. Some wealthy men apparently made a show of putting large amounts of money into the coffers. A poor widow stepped forward in the line to contribute two of the smallest copper coins. It was everything she had to live on.

The issue for people living in first century Jerusalem is the same as it is for those of us living in twenty-first century America: generosity is usually defined as optional giving that comes out of one's surplus of resources, after all personal needs and desires have been met. This story challenges that definition of generosity.

This is Kingdom of God generosity. It is defined by what God calls us to give. And what God calls us to give is everything that we have in love and service towards others. Of course, the story is symbolic; God calls us to give more than just money. And yet, what we do with our money is generally considered an excellent measure of what we value, of what we love and serve.




The widow's offering is an extraordinary contrast to the offerings made by the wealthy men. It is the difference between giving sacrificially and giving out of what's left over. It is an extraordinary challenge for us. Most of us are much more like the wealthy men in the story, even if we are not wealthy; giving everything away, even for the sake of God, feels out of reach for us.

And yet, we know that there is Truth in the story. We know that God has called us to give everything. So, we continue to work on ourselves; we ask God to transform us, to make us into a generous people who will give everything for the sake of the Kingdom.

# MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR

# **Dwelling, Discerning & Experimenting**



Alan Roxburgh, in his addresses to the NACCC, encouraged three practices if the church is to reverse its decline: Dwelling, Discerning, and Experimenting.

"Dwelling" for Roxburgh is intentionally identifying with our community, sitting around tables with the peoples of the community and listening to them with the desire to understand their needs and hopes.

"Discerning" refers to coming to understand how the Holy Spirit is working around us. The church is not declining because God is not working. God is always at work to reach out to the peoples of the world God created to draw them from sin and death to life. It is not easy to discern how and where the Spirit is working, and when we sense the Spirit may be working, we are not always certain.

Jeremiah told the exiles to "dwell" in Babylon and seek the welfare of the cities where they lived. I have mentioned before that others were pushing the exiles to expect a quick return to Judah and a resumption of the way things had been. A Jewish community was established in Babylon, and when a return to Judah did become possible, not all of the Jewish people did return. The laws of the Old Testament assumed an agricultural village life, and as the people adapted to new ways of living their leaders worked to reinterpret the laws for new situations. These interpretations that built up around the Torah were eventually codified as the Talmud. In fact there were two Talmuds: a Palestinian Talmud and a Babylonian Talmud. We should note that it was the Babylonian Talmud that became normative for Judaism.

In the early days after the life of Jesus and the establishment of His church, the apostles stayed in Jerusalem and continued to pray and worship at the Jerusalem temple. In the book of Acts we see how the Holy Spirit worked to change things. Persecution began the scattering of believers.

Our author will select a Sunday afternoon in February for her presentation so watch for an update. Be sure to invite your friends and family for an interesting talk and gourmet refreshments.



# **GETTING TO KNOW PILGRIM'S CHOIR**

At Pilgrim Congregational Church we are very proud of our music program, especially the Pilgrim Choir. We are eager to introduce our choir members to all our Pilgrim family and friends. For November we would like to introduce long time Pilgrim Choir member and Music Director, **Susan Winckler**, and new bass soloist, **Jeremy Taylor**.

**Susan Winckler** has been Music Director since 2006 for Pilgrim Church. She also shares the organist position with Bruce Jones. Susan also served as soprano soloist at Pilgrim from 1981 to 1988 soloing in such works as the Brahms and Verdi Requiems.

Ms. Winckler attained her B.A. in Music from Dominican University in San Rafael, California, and her M.A. in Music Theory and Composition from the University of Hawaii. Ms. Winckler has been organist and/or Choir Director for various local churches including La Verne Church of the Brethren; Grace Lutheran,

Glendora; Cucamonga United Methodist, Rancho Cucamonga; and St. Madeleine's, Pomona. Ms. Winckler has conducted numerous major choral works with full orchestra including the Verdi *Requiem*, Mozart's *Coronation Mass*, Puccini's *Messa di Gloria* and *Requiem* by Andrew Lloyd Webber. She was a long-time member of and Assistant Director for the Louis Rondfeldt Chorale and also directed the Claremont Chorale from 1978 to 1981.

Ms. Winckler, presently retired from teaching in public schools after 33 years, was choral director for Rancho Cucamonga, Chaffey, and Ganesha high schools. She has also taught Latin, mathematics, and art. Lately, in addition to music, she has been expressing her creative skills through ceramics and jewelry making.



Jeremy Taylor came to Southern California ten years ago to pursue a liberal arts education at Pomona College. He studied Voice under the late Prof. Gwendolyn Lytle, and received awards and funding for his musicological research from the American Musicological Society under the enduring mentorship of Prof. Donna Di Grazia, conductor of the Pomona College Choir. After graduating in 2019 with a B.A. in Music, he continues to work there in Data Administration. Jeremy has performed around the United States, Europe and recently in Hong Kong. He has appeared with ensembles such as the PRISM Choral Ensemble, Artes Vocales, Pomona College Glee Club, and recently with Mountainside Master Chorale. He spent his childhood in Tennessee and Arkansas with his family, and experienced church community and music--especially Black Gospel--from a young age. Jeremy is grateful for the opportunity to formally be a part of the Pilgrim Congregational Church Choir.




