MESSAGE FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

The Writing on Your Heart

"I the Lord test the mind and search the heart, to give to all according to their ways, according to the fruit of their doings." ~ Jeremiah 17:10

The prophet Jeremiah talks about the writing on our hearts. He says earlier in chapter 17 that the sins of Judah are written on their hearts and with a diamond-tipped iron pen. And then, more famously, later in chapter 31, Jeremiah says that God will write God's law on the hearts of the people. The one thing that is clear in Jeremiah is that *all people have something written on their hearts.*

Verse 10 of chapter 17, quoted above, makes it clear that God judges us according to what is written on our hearts. And what is written is determined by our ways and the fruit of our lives.

Even if God is fundamentally merciful and loving, God is also just and righteous. The idea of an eternal hell with eternal punishment does not make much sense, but our separation from God through our own poor ways of living is hell enough.

One question rises above all others in these texts from Jeremiah: What are we writing on our hearts? The world and our communities are filled with extremely challenging obstacles. We may or may not be able to surmount all that we face.



And yet, all these obstacles are also opportunities for us to enjoy the blessings of life, to have God's law of love and righteousness written on our hearts, to be able to give while expecting nothing in return. Suffering and death in our midst hold the promise of resurrection and new life, if we will only respond with lives of faithful, genuine compassion.

Pilgrim Congregational Church is a spiritual home that helps all of us to write God's will on our hearts. Jeremiah often issues harsh judgements of his people when sins are written on their hearts. But perhaps it would be harsher to refrain from such proclamations since nothing is worse than separation from God and nothing is better than doing God's will.

MESSAGE FROM THE MODERATOR



The early part of a new year is a busy time for many of us and for the church under any circumstances. And this year holds additional challenges for us. Every year the Trustees work with Boards and Committees that receive funds through the church's budgeting process and consider the pledges made by church members and friends, and the prospects

for the economy and our investments to propose a church budget for the year. Professor William Hasselbrink was my economics teacher in college. He used to begin the course by saying," Economics is called the dismal science, but it is not properly a science. It is, however, quite dismal." He would go on to explain that economics is about scarcity. There is not as much of anything as everyone might want. Families, nations, and churches must reflect on how much is available, and how to best use it. The professor was something of a character on our little campus, but I had a lot of respect for him. He encouraged us to go out of our comfort zones in doing our research and writing for our Senior Seminar, which was a capstone project for the Bachelor's degree programs. After my graduation, I learned that he had gone on to earn a second doctorate in Religion.

For a number of years the annual budget process has forced us as a church to confront the fact that we can not continue to operate the church at the level we are accustomed to on the basis of our pledges alone. The trustees have worked out ways to borrow from funds that were donated as endowments for the time being, but no one wants to continue outspending our giving indefinitely. Every year we are challenged to prayerfully consider our pledge and increase our giving if possible. At our town hall meeting on January 5th, we were told that 2024's giving actually exceeded what was pledged , and our pledges for 2025 represented an increase over the previous year. Both of these statements are encouraging, but there is something else that must be considered.

We need to prayerfully consider and work to help the church to grow in the number of people we touch, and who covenant with us to worship and work together. I have not missed the fact that the church has added members in recent years, both from new adults visiting and eventually joining our fellowship and from young adults completing their confirmations. I have been encouraged that these new members have been active, serving on boards and committees in the church and investing their time and talents in the ministry of the church. My point is that we need to be more deliberate in prayerfully seeking ways to reach out to new families. One person will not be able to make the church grow alone. One board or committee will not be able to do it. It will take all of us praying and working together. If we are continually looking for God's plan and acting in faith to join in, God will provide the increase.







- 3. Enter Enrollment Code: 535323LC11L99 (case sensitive.) This code allows the profit from the sale to be applied to Pilgrim.
- 4. Create your personal account following the steps.
- 5. Go to Account in upper right hand corner.
- 6. Payment Options is located on left side. Strongly suggest you use a credit card and add the information at check out.
- 7. Order items and follow steps to place and check out your order.

The profits from each order will apply to Pilgrim Church once a month. You will be responsible for any charges (shipping/transaction fees.) Raise Right customer service is available to assist as well. If you have any questions, please call the church office at 909-622-1373.

Please note the following updates to Pilgrim Office procedures:



- * Natalie Brown has been promoted from Administrative Assistant to Office Manager. This means that Natalie now has the title for many of the things that she was already doing. Please do start with Natalie if you have any questions or wish to communicate information to us about custodial or other church administrative needs. - * James Stevenson, our Custodian and Maintenance Supervisor, is in his third year as a full-time employee. His schedule varies depending on events and activities at the church, but he is present most weekdays from 9 am till 5 pm.






