## Senior Minister's Message



## **Chariots of Fire**

"As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven" ~ 2 Kings 2:11

In the fall of my senior year in high school, 1981, I went to the theater to see the British movie, "Chariots of Fire." It's about two Olympic runners, Eric Liddell, a devout son of Congregationalist missionaries to China from Scotland, and Harold Abrahams, a Jewish Englishman longing to be accepted as a part of the nation's elite.

There are several themes in this complex movie: patriotism, racism, friendship, discipline, loyalty, and romantic relationships. For example, on the one hand, the movie is filled with moments of British national pride, the Union Jack and Olympic fervor saturate several scenes. On the other hand, the two protagonists each have deep commitments that greatly exceed their bonds of citizenship to Britain, Liddell to his God and Abrahams to his people.

As a young Christian and a devoted athlete, I was struck by Liddell's story. This superstar acknowledged his Godgiven gift for running, but he was willing to sacrifice all of that for the glory of God. In the 1924 Olympic Games, he competed in and won gold in the 400-meter race after refusing to race in the 100-meter competition because it was held on Sunday. The next year he returned to China as a missionary teacher and aside from two furloughs in Scotland, he remained in China until his death at the age of 43 in a Japanese civilian internment camp near the end of World War II.

The wonderful movie title has a direct connection to Elijah's chariot of fire from 2 Kings, by way of the English hymn, "Jerusalem." The image of Elijah being whisked away by a chariot of fire beautifully and mysteriously expresses the glory of God through the life and death of God's chosen prophet. Our lives are filled with important commitments of all sorts, including family, nation, team, and community. Yet we must willingly sacrifice them all in a chariot of fire.

## **Associate Minister's Message**

I am honored to begin as your Associate Minister of Families and Youth. The Youth-led worship on May 18<sup>th</sup> showcased how involved the youth are in the life of Pilgrim Church. They were excited to participate. In the group there were natural leaders and, equally important, natural supporters working together. Parents were actively parenting. Church members enthusiastically followed the young people's lead. And some VIPs to the program were visibly touched to be recognized. With the help of God, there is a lot of good to build upon.

## **Associate Minister's Message**

This oft quoted phrase comes after Jesus says, "It is easier for a camel to go through an eye of a needle than a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven." When the disciples ask, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus replies, "...with God all things are possible."

So, if we trust God, which is the definition of faith Christianly speaking, then the impossible falls away to what is possible. Christian community and experience are key to helping all of us discern what is the voice of God and what is the distorted voice of another's will. Each of you, your words, your decisions, impact our young's view of Jesus. Similarly, if we are humble enough, the words of our youth and their choices will impact our view of Jesus. We don't have to try to go through the eye of the needle to find heaven; instead, we get to let God lead us through a different opening often found in community.

Please pray for our youth, for their connections to one another, to the work of Jesus in their lives, and their ability to feel wholly loved. And if you are one of the young people, please pray for your parents and those in our faith community that they might grow in their faith, continue to do good work, and feel the love of Jesus deep down in their souls. Let us trust The Lover of our Souls to work miracles in one another's lives and to grow our community of faith.

## RISE UP, SHINE... and MOVE!

Once upon a time, in a land far, far away I was a young man.

Like a lot of young men, I didn't have much direction and no real inner compass to guide me. Even though I had good parents who taught me well, I was always an independent thinker, blazing my own trail. This worked for and against me many times. Sometimes I would be frozen, not knowing my next steps and unable to move. Other times I would run off into the wild blue yonder without a care in the world throwing all caution to the wind.

It was as a younger man, that I learned something very helpful about decision-making that has stayed with me. During one of my cross-country motorcycle trips, I realized I needed directions, so I pulled over to regroup. I found a spot near the entry of a gated subdivision. I sat there on my Harley, looking at my [paper] map, and looking pretty good in my black leather gear. Cars were coming in and out of the subdivision, and everyone seemed pretty interested in me being there. I might have even been parked on a red curb, but I was minding my own business trying to figure out my way – my next move. I really couldn't decide what to do next and I was stuck.

In a few minutes, a Police Officer showed up and asked me what I was doing there. I told him I just pulled off the freeway to figure out where I was going and what to do next. And he said something I would never forget, he said: "Well, you have to move. I don't care where you go or what you do, but you have to move. Just get moving." So, I moved and rode down the street and found a nice park, to make a plan, and get back on the road, which turned out to be a good decision.

It was from that experience that I learned a life lesson. Sometimes, I can overthink what to do or just stay stuck because I don't have an answer. Other times, I stay in the same place because I just can't see the road ahead of me. But sitting and doing nothing never brought me closer to a goal. So, I learned I just needed to get moving and it doesn't always matter the direction because usually the path will unfold.

In our current Church life, I think a lot of us don't know what to do, so we just don't move. We might sit and wait for a sign or direction or maybe even inspiration. If you can relate, I want to encourage you to **just get moving**. You might not have the perfect move, or plan or idea, but you can do something, and you can go somewhere in our church. EVERYONE in our church has talents and ideas and skills. The First step to moving, is to RISE UP. Our theme this year is <u>Rise up and Shine</u>. So, I'm going to add to that, RISE UP, SHINE and MOVE (just don't move out of the church!) We are going to move into action, move into change, move into initiative.

One thing I have learned for sure about Pilgrims is we have opinions, and we are good at sharing them. As your Moderator this year, I'm making a commitment to listen and hear your feedback. Tell me what's happening and let's MOVE towards action instead of discussion. I will also challenge you to RISE UP, SHINE and get moving! Let's move forward together to create a place of community, love and hope. We will RISE UP and show God's love to everyone in our home and community.



#### Liturgical Notes by Rev. Dr. Patrick Horn:

**White** symbolizes purity, innocence, and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the Liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter.

**Red** is the color of sacrifice and is used during Palm Sunday, Holy Week, Pentecost, and the feasts of the apostles and the martyrs.

**Green** symbolizes growth and life, hope and anticipation. Green is used in Ordinary time, the period of the Church calendar which gives attention to the Lord's life and ministry; it reminds us that the mission of the Church is to love the world and share the hope of Christ.
