Senior Minister's Message



The Freedom to Confront

"The sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste." ~ Amos 7:9

The story of Amos is the story of a prophet who is compelled by God to confront the sins of Israel and to declare God's judgement on the king and the nation of Israel. As Congregationalist Christians and as Americans, we celebrate this month that we come from traditions that recognize the freedom to confront the sins of our own institutions.

Our Congregationalist ancestors left the British Isles, confronting and challenging the restrictions that the state-supported institutional church had placed on worship and the practice of faith. The Declaration of Independence includes a list of more than 20 grievances against King George III, mostly having to do with the king suppressing the freedoms of individuals and the courts and laws which protect those freedoms.

Thus, the freedom to confront our institutions is a birthright that comes from being both American and Congregationalist. Unfortunately, we often forget that this freedom to confront, to act in political ways for the sake of freedom, is rooted in our value as creations of God, not in our partisan alignments. Both the early Congregationalists and the early Americans clearly identified the divine roots of their freedom.

Political activity is a divine right, but partisanship is not. Of course, I am not naïve enough to think that our country could operate without political parties. Partisan politics is a reminder that all of us are on journeys of self-discovery, determining with God's help who we are before God. But God's love does not show favoritism, and to the degree which we are participants in that love, we will not be chiefly motivated by partisan goals and divisions.

While the Bible demonstrates that God often operates within the political structures of a given time, Amos reminds us that there are times when God's righteousness requires action outside of those human structures. As we celebrate our freedom this month, let us remember to celebrate our value as creations of God, endowed with a liberty to speak the truth of righteousness to our own institutions.

Associate Minister's Message



It is the season of Pentecost, the time of the year that we celebrate the arrival of the Spirit of Jesus, also known as the Holy Spirit. There are many kinds of spirits out there that seek to uncreate us. For example, spirits of fear or prejudice undo peace, grace, and love. They do not breathe new life into the world. The Holy Spirit, on the other hand, is the Spirit Jesus left behind. It is a Spirit that gives life. We know the Holy Spirit is present when the guidance we receive from HS fits with the acts of Jesus.

How would you characterize the life of Jesus?

Go ahead and take some time to reflect and even write on it as God moves you.

I chose three to discuss with your young people:

1. **Jesus broke down walls.** He was as comfortable eating at the table with the tax collector, Zaccheus, as he was having a conversation at a well with a woman who lived with a "man not her husband." I know the Holy Spirit is involved when I act in ways that break down walls.

2. Jesus had conversations and told stories to bring people into a deeper understanding of God. While he engaged in some political action, like telling a story about a rich man who would be eternally thirsty because he didn't care for the poor man on his doorstep, Jesus' words and actions pointed to God. I know Holy Spirit is acting through me when the words I speak and the actions I choose point to the Eternal One.

3. Jesus took healing seriously. We do not know the hurt that people carry and often unconsciously act out. You might have heard the phrase, "hurt people, hurt people." I find it interesting that one of the more well-known stories of Jesus is his healing of lepers. Being healed, for a leper, means going from not being able to feel to being able to feel. We might say, the Holy Spirit leads us to feel and heal.

I know I'm motivated by the Holy Spirit when I can feel for another, when I can see their light even if clouded by misbehavior. Further, the Holy Spirit continues to work in me when I'm honest enough to pray for healing (mine and another's), to ask that eyes be opened, and to send fear and prejudice away. In these moments of connection to the Holy Spirit, there's a deep calm that washes over me and my feet feel more firmly planted upon the ground.

Moderator's Message

RISE UP, SHINE and BE BLESSED!

I have to make a confession. Whenever I hear those trendy expressions like "too blessed to be stressed" or see the hashtag #blessed on social media, I roll my eyes. I've also rolled my eyes many times when my wife tries to remind me of what she calls my "daily blessings" like shelter, food, family and meaningful relationships. The dictionary definition of blessed doesn't even mention anything about good fortune and, in fact, it says something is made holy when it is blessed. Well, I'm certainly not holy. I'm not going to be convinced that we are "blessed" by all these circumstantial things, and I've made up my mind.

But you know, God has a funny way of opening my eyes to show me something different, and it happened a few months ago. Christine took me to her nail salon to get a pedicure. It's great to be pampered (still I wouldn't call it a blessing.) The nail technician spoke with a heavy accent. I asked if she was from the US or another country and she shared that she had immigrated from Vietnam about three years ago. So, I asked, "How do you like it here?" Then she started BEAMING. She said she was so lucky and fortunate to be in America, and to live and work in freedom. She said she is happy to share a two-bedroom apartment with 5 family members and to have a kitchen, bathrooms and air conditioning. She said she has a much better life living in the US because she is allowed to go to school and work and go anywhere she wants without fear. Then she said it..." I am blessed." But I didn't roll my eyes this time.

It occurred to me that she is blessed, and so am I. I've just been looking at things in a different way and her view of being blessed opened my eyes. I am blessed to have a home, family, freedom, employment, food, and the ability to worship without fear of punishment or imprisonment. Then I realized that our church is very blessed, and I was motivated to join the movement and count my blessings. I couldn't find any specific Biblical scripture that supports the trendy phrase, "we are blessed," but it is clear we are.

As individuals, we are blessed with the freedom to disagree without fear; we have liberties protected by law and rights guaranteed within a democratic society.

As a church, we are blessed. We have a beautiful building that has housed generations of Christians and provided a historical place of worship. We have a place to come and see our friends, have coffee, pray for each other and have fellowship. We have dedicated staff who work hard and devote themselves to the ministry of the church. We have extraordinary volunteers who serve on boards and committees and pledge themselves to church service.

If we are dedicated or consecrated to God, then we are holy and we are blessed!

This July, we will celebrate our freedoms and give thanks for Independence Day. I think we can add to that too. Give thanks for what we do have instead of what we don't have. Focus our minds on abundance and not lack. Rise up and count our blessings. Rise up and "Let the favor of God be upon us." Psalm 90:17



IN MEMORY OF ROBERT AND GRACIA FAY ELLWOOD



Obituaries

Gracia Fay Ellwood (Bouwman) entered the light of the Peaceable Kingdom she longed for on May 29, 2025, at the age of 86. She was preceded in death by her parents George and Alice and by her older sister Gladys. She is survived by her older brother Gareth and her younger sister Rebecca Haagsma (Gerrit), and many nieces and nephews. Gracia Fay was a dearly beloved wife, mother, and grandmother. She was a Quaker for most of her life, as well as a scholar, poet, vocalist, and essayist. She held a doctorate in philosophy of religion and had a passion for animals, a fascination with the afterlife, and a love of Jane Austen's novels.

Robert Ellwood passed into the joy of the Eternal on June 5, 2025, at the age of 91. He was preceded in death by his parents Robert and Nola, and by his beloved wife Gracia Fay, just one week before he passed away. He is survived by his sister Audrey Ledgerwood (Tom) and niece Sherry. Robert was a beloved husband, father, and grandfather. He was an ordained Episcopal priest, served as chaplain in the US Navy, and later as a priest in the Liberal Catholic Church. He held a doctorate in history of religion and was a world religions professor at the University of Southern California. He was the author of popular textbooks on world religions, mythology, religious movements, and devotional books that modeled his own quest for faith and joy.

Robert and Gracia Fay taught us how to live with grace and die in peace. They leave two children, Richard Scott Lancelot Ellwood and Fay Elanor Ellwood, her husband Patrick Horn, and their son Finnian Scott Horn Ellwood.




