Senior Minister's Message



The Peaceable Kingdom

"The wolf shall live with the lamb."
Isaiah 9:6

I had the extraordinary fortune to live with my mother-in-law, Gracia Fay Ellwood, for nearly the last five years of her life. And this prophetic passage from Isaiah 9 was her center. She was particularly moved by the painting this passage inspired, titled "Peaceable Kingdom," by the American Quaker artist Edward Hicks (1780-1845):



Off to the left is portrayed the scene of William Penn and other leaders signing a treaty with natives who lived on the land. Isaiah's vision of peace and harmony is a vision for both the natural world and the political world. And, for Gracia Fay, this vision was both immanent (in this life) and transcendent (beyond this life), which meant that she lived every moment of her life guided by this vision in her relations with the whole of Creation.

Isaiah's vision of eternal peace and harmony reveals to us the Kingdom that Jesus preached. This is the vision that we, too, are called to live. In this season of advent and Christmas, let us give ourselves to the peaceable kingdom.

Miner's Musings Yesterday and Today



In Deuteronomy 26, the Israelites speak a litary of thanksgiving that touches upon the generational gifts God has given to them. They remember how their ancestors were set free from slavery; how God led them through the wilderness for a generation; and how they have been led to live in the promised land. This litary of thanksgiving is part of their harvest worship.

A friend wrote me on my birthday and reminded me how different is my life today than it was last year. I remembered. Last year I was a case manager for refugee families—an odd job I picked up to help meet the bills as I took time to find my next church call. Each day was filled with helping mostly Iraqi women, who had lost their homes in the war on terrorism, navigate the health and welfare services so they and their families could live with dignity. It was sometimes highly frustrating work and other times beautifully sweet as I got to see the people beyond the hijab. I am grateful for that connective work at a time when I felt disconnected.

Today I also remember you, dear Pilgrim Church. Watching you dance and sing on our Karaoke/Line Dance night was a joy. Pilgrim's Rummage Sale which acts both as a ministry and a fundraiser touched many. Some of you have given me the gift to see beyond the outer dressings of your public selves. Further, I am blessed to greet and talk with Pilgrim's young people before and after church, in texts throughout the week, and during the many programs Christian Ed offers. I'm grateful for you.

Lastly, I give thanks for those who have led me to the Eternal One, both those who I continue to chat with in person, and those I know through their writings. Small group conversations have been integral to my living faith. In view of that...

I am offering a short Advent Study using the book *Voices of Advent* by Matthew Skinner. The Hybrid Advent Study meets on November 24, December 8, 15, and 22nd from 11:30 – 12:30.

Moderator's Message



RISE UP and SAY NO

I've been bombarded with messages in the media, community and society asking me to say "yes" to a cause or event. Right now, I'm receiving tons of mail from charities asking me to say "yes" and support their programs. There is an overwhelming message that I have to say "yes" to make a difference in our world. This is all well and good and I agree with it most of the time. But I realized it is equally important to learn how to say "no".

In my family, I'm encouraging everyone to say "no" to too much screen time, TV, and video games. My wife is asking us all to say "no" to over-indulging in sweets and treats in anticipation of the holidays. (I don't like that much, but I agree with her.) I'm asking my work team to say "no" to unnecessary mental stress, avoidable squabbles, and even improperly prioritizing work over family.

Some of us old timers remember Nancy Reagan's campaign to "Just Say No" prevalent in the early 1980's and is still used as a cultural reference today. This resounding "NO" turned out to be a good thing. Sometimes saying No is the healthiest thing we can do.

In our daily lives, there is a choice to say NO to negative influences, disagreements and discord. Even though this can be challenging, it helps to remember what Jesus tells us: "In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33.) In our church, I think we should say no to unforgiveness, defeat, and division. In our own minds, let's say no to defeating thoughts that are not leading us to God's purpose. The great thing about saying NO is that it makes room for us to say YES to more important things.

When we say NO to things that don't serve God, we'll be able to say YES to a thriving church home, a united community and loving families. As we enter the beautiful Christmas Season, remember to RISE UP and say NO to anything that does not bring you closer to God's Peace and say YES to compassion, cooperation and Christian Love. Then you can say YES to supporting Pilgrim Church.

Trustee's Message






Copies of the proposed budget will be available to members beginning **January 11**th.





Liturgical Notes by Rev. Dr. Patrick Horn

White symbolizes purity, innocence and birth. It is associated with the brightness of the heavens during daytime and was used to symbolize the purity of heaven and the angels. It also came to be associated with joy, celebration, and peace. White is the Liturgical color of Christmas, Epiphany, and Easter. **Purple** was originally associated with royalty because it was a more expensive color to dye, and it was used to welcome the coming of a king. It also evokes pain and suffering. Purple symbolizes fasting, faith, patience, and trust. It is the liturgical color used during the seasons of penance, Advent, and Lent. For Advent, purple symbolizes the impending birth of Jesus while foreshadowing his death.
