Senior Minister's Message



What is the Serpent?

“Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made.”

Genesis 3:1

When I was a freshman in college, I had the extraordinary privilege of taking Old Testament courses with Dr. Karen Joines. He is the only man I have ever known with the name, “Karen.” But more importantly, he was an amazing scholar, archaeologist, and theologian, from whom I learned more about the biblical text than any other professor I ever had the pleasure of studying with.

Dr. Joines was an expert on many Old Testament issues, but his first published book was on the symbolism of the serpent. The serpent is used as a symbol in several passages, the most well-known, of course, found in the story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. Dr. Joines wrote that the serpent in the garden was not the same character in the book of Job referred to as Satan (the accuser) but was rather patterned after stories from Mesopotamian culture, “a strange combination of life, wisdom, and chaos.”

Oversimplifying from a distance of 3 or 4 thousand years, the serpent in the Garden of Eden seems to express the human desire to be like God. We are tempted to think that if we only had all of the knowledge, we might be equal with God, or at least, able to succeed at life. When we succumb to this temptation, innocence is lost and chaos ensues.

This passage from Genesis 3 is part of the lectionary reading for the first Sunday in Lent. Thus Lent begins in the messiness of our lives, in the temptation to think that we only need the right knowledge to be whole and in the reality that we have already lost our innocence.

Thus we begin the Lent season acknowledging our lost innocence and our need for God. The story of the serpent in the Garden reminds us that we have already tried and failed without God. Let us prepare our hearts for the One who redeems us and makes us whole.

Framing Matters

I have some beautiful paintings that rest under my bed because I've not yet taken the time to frame them. A poor framing dulls a picture; whereas, a good framing allows the colors to pop. Even more, good framing can draw a room together, creating a delightful cohesion.

The framing we put on our decisions, our work, and what occurs around us also matters. When you frame things poorly, it dulls the truth and washes away the good work of God in you. When you take the time to frame things well, to do so prayerfully and with the knowledge that God is working for your good, then you see colors you've not seen before. You are strengthened to hold fast to truth and to see your work as a larger work of God.

Framing matters.

Stop and consider...is there something that has been creating a soul ache inside of you? Maybe it is something someone said or a very present struggle. It is likely something that intrudes upon your daily thoughts.

Bring that to mind. Breathe. Ask God in. Journal if that is your way. Stay in prayer until God provides you a frame for the struggle. You'll know it is God because it will be a frame that rejects judgment in favor of love; resists contraction and invites expansion; and helps you see your part in God's work this day. You'll be able to say with Joseph, the dreamer who wore a colorful coat, that whatever others meant for ill, God will use for good.

When we can frame our work as part of God's purpose for us, then we find cohesion in our work together as Christ's community. Cohesion attracts more people to our campus. As people look upon us, the colors of our various ministries pop and bring a delight that keeps people coming. Until, one day, a guest sees their place, and adds the color of their ministry to greater church that is our Lord's work among us.

May our framing lead us to be what Paul pleaded for in 1 Corinthians 1:10

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you but that you be knit together in the same mind and the same purpose.

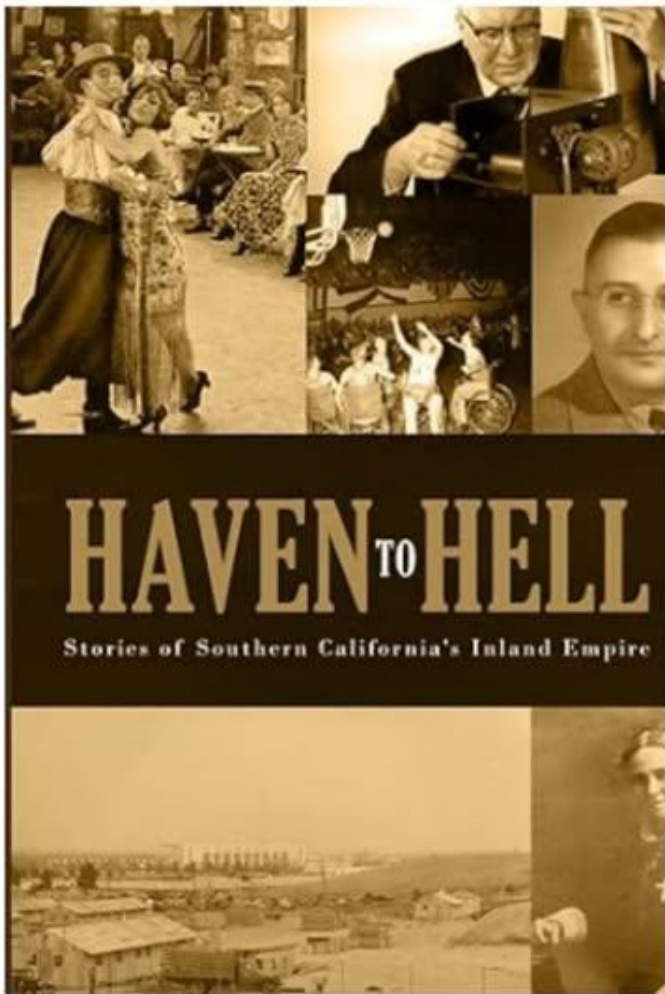

George Haven – Rancho Cucamonga's main street is named for him – was one of the luckiest miners of the Gold Rush. Everything he touched became golden.

The Earp family came by wagon train to San Bernardino in 1864. Ironically, the Earps later had to travel east in order to become legends in the Old West.

Chester Carlson invented the first photocopier and created Xerox. But his early years were tough -- he once lived in a converted San Bernardino chicken coop.
