# Senior Minister's Message



## A Great Light

*"The people who sat in Darkness have seen a great light."*

*Matthew 4:16*

During Advent, our good friend, Patrick Blackwell, beautifully sang “The People that Walked in Darkness” from Handel’s *Messiah*. That text comes from the book of Isaiah. But it is also found in the Gospel of Matthew because Matthew recognized it as a prophetic text about Jesus.

The original Hebrew text from Isaiah references the land of Galilee, where Jesus began and conducted most of his ministry. For Matthew, it was an area that was very Jewish, very Greek, and very Roman, or as Isaiah put it, “Galilee of the nations,” meaning that it was a Jewish area with many Gentiles.

But what made it a place of darkness? One of my respected scholarly acquaintances, Jonathan Reed, described it thusly:

“Chronic and seasonal disease, especially malaria, cut down significant segments of the population and left even the healthy quite often ill. The age structure was youthful, women bore many children, random death made family and household patterns ephemeral, young men were often mobile, and elderly women especially vulnerable.”

Into these circumstances Jesus and his disciples launched his ministry. We can well understand why so much emphasis is placed on Jesus’ healing ministry. His ministry of healing and his teachings of a coming heavenly kingdom were a bright and shining light for a people weighed down by the darkness of physical suffering and Roman political oppression.

The message of the Gospel is always a great light for those who are suffering. In our own place and time, billions of people have enjoyed the fruits of technological progress, especially great medical advances that have improved health and lengthened life expectancy. And yet, we are still surrounded by darkness: an epidemic of loneliness and a significant portion of people who live in an economic and housing crisis.

In these circumstances Pilgrim must be the Church, the carriers of a Great Light. Let us preach and teach and serve a coming heavenly kingdom that brings compassion and hope to those in need in Pomona and our surrounding neighborhoods.

# Moderator's Message

Essentially this means it takes the same amount of work to think about a negative outcome as it does to imagine a positive outcome and the choice is always ours.




# Trustee's Message





# Historian's Report



I came across some interesting information about churches and labyrinths. There are approximately 5,000 registered labyrinths in the United States, with one being designated in Pomona. That is the one maintained by our neighbor, St. Paul's Episcopal Church on Alvarado Avenue. Theirs is an outdoor labyrinth and is used year-round.

Pilgrim Church has a labyrinth, a very large portable canvas one that is used in the church gymnasium and sometimes in Pilgrim Hall during holy week. It was created decades ago by Pilgrim Youth Pastor Elaine Brown. We are going to place our Pilgrim Church labyrinth on the National Labyrinth Register. This will offer yet another draw for people to visit us and to become interested in Pilgrim Church!

Labyrinth meditation and prayer go back centuries and use of them is global. Most labyrinths are modeled after the one at Chartres Cathedral in France, but research shows there are many other shapes and patterns used by different faiths, tribes and locales. Some are truly mazes. Labyrinths have mostly been used for religious meditation, but more recently have been discovered to have stress-reducing and mental health improvement benefits. For those who cannot get out to a physical labyrinth site, there are actually books available from Amazon (!!!!) with finger tracing labyrinth format capability, also, labyrinth coloring books. An ancient concept of meditative focus, very useful in today's complex and stress heavy challenges.

I remember lovely experiences at Pilgrim with our canvas labyrinth being spread out using the entirety of the Pilgrim Hall floor. Participants entered this quiet dimly lit space, and usually sat for a few moments first, collecting their thoughts and getting focused... and then silently walking the pattern with all its switchbacks, deep in thought. There was no talking before or after. It was like a private journey in a sacred atmosphere, after which you emerged out in the parking lot, feeling like "something" had settled in you.

So I am delighted that our Pilgrim labyrinth has been safely maintained and utilized for many, many years. Now we qualify to join the National Registry as we continue to make use of an ancient rite in the twenty first century in our church home in Pomona!
