Senior Minister's Message



Witnesses

“We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem.”

Acts 10:39

In the book of Acts, the apostles repeatedly affirm their status as witnesses to the events in the life of Jesus.

When we think of witnesses, we immediately think of the courtroom testimony of a witness to a crime or other legally questionable activity. The role of the witness in a court trial is to provide truthful information from a particular perspective that can then be used to either prosecute or defend an accused person. That information is made part of the case, either for or against the accused, to persuade jurors of the truth of that case.

In Acts, references are frequently made to the activities of Jesus, preaching, teaching, and healing, but also including his death on a cross and his resurrection from death. And, often, these references are given in courtroom type settings in which the apostles are being charged with some crime. Thus, it is no accident that in the book of Acts we get lots of legal language that seems to fit in a courtroom.

Paul and the other apostles are constantly giving accounts of themselves in places where they are accused of wrongdoing. And so, they describe themselves as witnesses to the truth, namely, the truth of the gospel message, the good news that through faith in Christ one receives forgiveness of sins.

The truth that they testify to is not ultimately concerned to give a factual account of the events of Jesus' life. The truth that they testify to is the power of God, through the death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ, to transform one's life from sinfulness to forgiveness, from death to new life. They are witnesses testifying to the power of the resurrection.

The apostles began the work of the Church, spreading the good news of redemption through faith in Christ. They were faithful witnesses to that good news. And, as members of the Church, the Body of Christ, we are participants in that work. We are witnesses to that same truth.

Associate Minister's Message



Have you ever been praying and praying and were given no answer?

During the Monday morning study on prayer we talked about this very thing. We all have experienced disappointment in prayer. Sometimes God says “no.” Other times “not yet.” And, sometimes the answer is silence. Don’t you hate that?!

I was teaching about how we sometimes need to allow God to reframe our prayer. I paused and a member of the group spoke up, saying something along the lines of this:

How come we focus on the one prayer in ten that is not answered? Why not remember the nine answered prayers?

His word to us changed my whole focus this week. Instead of focusing on the one unanswered prayer, I look at all the answered prayers. A meeting scheduled weeks ago happened at the most relevant time--hey, that was an answer to prayer. A word I was given that helped make sense of a situation, that too, was an answer to prayer. Doing something that was hard with integrity and calm, you got it, another answer to prayer.

Looking at the day through answered prayer makes my days better.

And, we can go one step further. Two of the three moments I described involved another person. People’s actions provide answers to prayer. Which leads me to ask you, “how can you be an answer to someone’s prayer?”

Moderator's Message



RISE UP FOR HE HAS RISEN!

My parents, especially my Mother, made a big deal out of our Easter celebrations. We dressed in our best new Easter clothes and went to church. Then, I couldn't wait to come home and see my Easter basket and hunt eggs with our extended family. We had a party with food and decorations. It was a pretty magical time. Maybe you remember being a kid too, sneaking around the house looking for those bright, colorful eggs—behind the couch, in a shoe, or even on the bookshelf. Every egg I found made me feel excited and proud. But then, as an adult, I realized the best surprise was right there in front of me, hiding in plain sight, and we were celebrating that Christ rose from the grave.

Along with candy and baskets, Easter is about the biggest surprise discovery ever. It happened when Mary Magdalene had her own “Easter egg hunt” when she went to the tomb, expecting to be sad. Instead, she found the stone moved away and the tomb empty! She was totally shocked when she realized Jesus was alive. That moment turned her sadness into pure joy (John 20:1–18.)

Just like Mary, I sometimes think things won't work out or get worried. Then it occurred to me that God loves to surprise me with hope, a lot like the Easter surprises we experienced as children. Easter is an event; it's a way of looking at life and our relationship to God. Easter isn't just something that happened a long time ago. For me, it's a real promise that Jesus is alive and hope is never gone, even if I don't notice it right away. Even today, Jesus turns sadness into happiness and searching into celebrating.

This Easter, whether you're hunting for eggs or hanging out with family, I hope we remember that the best treasure isn't hidden—it's the love of Jesus and it's everlasting. The empty tomb means we can live with joy, look forward to good things, and trust that God's surprises are always better than what we expect. Every egg you find can remind you that God's love shows up in the most unexpected places, bringing new life and endless hope.

I hope all Pilgrim Families and Friends experience the joy and hope of Easter, not only today, but throughout the year.
