Senior Minister's Message



Are Grace and Law Opposites?

*"He will repay according to each one's deeds."
Romans 2:6*

One of the most pervasive errors in the Christian theological tradition is the idea that salvation through God's grace in Christ has nothing to do with our moral deeds. This view is attributed to St. Paul and St. Augustine and then fully endorsed and advocated by the 16th century theologian, John Calvin. Many Christians thus hold the view that saving grace can only be grace if it is completely independent of our moral actions.

The main problem with this view is that it is not found in Jesus' teachings in the Gospels, or in the letter of James, or in the book of the Revelation, or even in Paul's letters. On the contrary, all these other New Testament texts unequivocally teach the final judgment according to deeds, that those who do good as set forth in either the law or under conscience (the law written on the heart) will be given Eternal Life and those who don't will suffer God's judgment (a time of wrath and fury.)

In Paul's writings, divine grace and human effort are collaborative. Of course, the power to perform good, moral deeds comes in the generosity of God's grace. But there is no opposition between grace and law. The whole of the New Testament affirms what is stated so clearly and obviously in James 2:24: "You see that a person is justified by works and not by faith alone."

So, what's the big deal? Why concern ourselves with these distinctions? My concern is that a certain kind of Christian thinking has grown out of this error of the opposition between grace and law. Many seem to think that faith consists only in the assertion of belief in God and saving grace in Christ. Accepting God's grace then is simply a matter of agreeing with it and saying the right words when the time comes.

This leaves out the works of goodness that come through faith in God's grace. Faith is a way of living, not just a way of thinking.

“The River of God is Full” PSALM 65

I have chosen an excerpt from Psalm 65 to serve as my theme for this year, with the meaning of this theme expressing how much love God has for us. It is our hope this project will strengthen worship experiences, enhance rental spaces, and extend the ministry beyond our campus walls. In our May meeting the committee continued to work on the needs of the implementation each of the phases – everyone’s feedback has been invaluable, thank you so much!

Master Plan: Outlines of the various upgrades the committee recommends are printed and available for your review, they can be found in Pilgrim Hall.

- Specific equipment components have been identified.
- Constructability review is underway by the Buildings and Grounds Committee of the Trustees in preparation for hiring contractors and vendors.

Fundraising: Our fundraising efforts will continue for some more time while we commence the implementation of improvements. The Committee has envelopes for in-person donations, and has Push Pay available for those who prefer to donate that way. Donations may also be made during the Offering at Sunday Worship Services. Timeline:

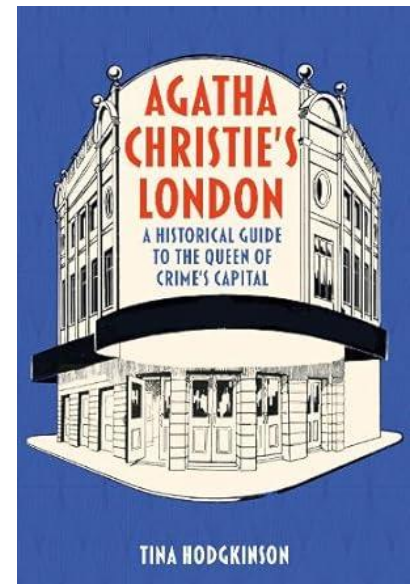

Carina Caballero is graduating from Montclair High School and Chaffey College. She will attend Cal Poly San Luis Obispo this Fall to study Engineering.

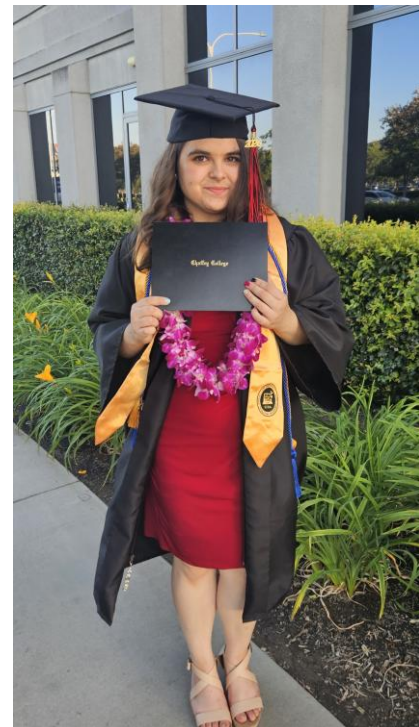
Samantha Campbell is graduating from Etiwanda High School and will attend Mt. San Antonio College in Fall.

A Grateful (and Slightly Loud) Thank You Message

Although I am not a member of Pilgrim Congregational Church, and my time working there has passed, the friendships and meaningful relationships I found within the Pilgrim community continue to be a lasting gift. Recently, many of those friendships came together in the most beautiful way – to help my family celebrate my grandfather’s 99th birthday.

First, a little context... My grandfather, Hugh P. Tanner, Sr., is one of my best friends – truly like a second father to me. I call him “Dude,” and every time I see him, I greet him with an enthusiastic (and, let’s be honest, very loud), “HEY, DUDE!” He wears hearing aids... and did I mention he just turned 99? At this point in our lives, volume is less a choice and more a well-tested strategy.

To celebrate this incredible milestone, we threw him a full-on cowboy-themed birthday party – bandanas, cowboy boots, and plenty of western flair. It was the kind of celebration that felt equal parts heartfelt and hoedown, made even more special by the generosity of four wonderful members of the Pilgrim community.

First, the beautiful ladies, Dulce Ruiz and Guadalupe Oseguera – members of the Pilgrim church congregation – showed up in the most thoughtful, generous, and graceful way. They picked up the food, greeted guests with warm smiles, helped serve the meal, and made sure everything ran smoothly behind the scenes. What incredible friends they are! The moment that will stay with me most was when Guadalupe said, “Thank you for letting us celebrate your cute grandfather with you.” That simple, kind sentiment meant more than I can put into words.

Bruce Jones – Pilgrim’s very own organist and master of music (my personal title for him!) – created a custom musical experience for my granddad’s birthday party on March 13. And when I say custom, I mean next-level. Bruce took classical works from Beethoven, Bach, and Chopin and somehow wove in personalized “Happy Birthday” messages that had the entire room smiling. During the planning process, Bruce shared stories with me about his own family’s cowboy heritage – stories that added richness and authenticity to the performance he ultimately created. You could tell this wasn’t just another piano gig; it was something he invested real time, heart, and personal history into.

And of course, he still managed to surprise us all – pivoting seamlessly into a unique rendition of “Eleanor Rigby” that delighted my younger, artsy cousins and brought a wave of nostalgia to the rest of the room. Bruce didn’t just perform – he entertained. Between the music, the humor, and a few perfectly timed zingers, he had the entire party laughing and completely charmed. It was thoughtful, creative, and honestly, just plain fun. He gave so generously of his time and talent, and it meant more than I can say.

And then there's Laurence Holmes – Pilgrim's incredible custodian, resident creative, and now, in my family's eyes, an official songwriter extraordinaire. Not only did Laurence help make the day run smoothly with set-up and clean-up, but he also offered to write an original song for my grandfather.

Yes, an original country western song. For a 99th birthday. No pressure at all!

Well, Laurence absolutely delivered. The song told the story of my grandfather's life – from his Mississippi roots to settling in California, his lifelong love for my grandmother (which began when they were just toddlers), and his joyful, laughter-filled approach to life. The song was heartfelt, personal, and so spot-on that there wasn't a dry eye in the room when it played. My parents, aunts, uncles, cousins – we were all emotional. (And if you know my family, that's saying something.)

The chorus alone says it all:

*Ride on Tanner, ride on Dude
99 years and still in the groove*

*Ride on Tanner, ride on Dude
The whole wide world tips its hat to you*

*Ride on Tanner, we love you true
Happy Birthday we're singing for you*

Bruce made us smile and sing. Laurence moved us to tears. Dulce and Guadalupe made it all feel seamless and full of heart. Together, they created a celebration we will never forget.

So, while I may not be an official member, I will always feel connected to Pilgrim – and deeply grateful for the people who make it so special.

Bruce, Laurence, Guadalupe and Dulce, **THANK YOU** for sharing your gifts and time so generously and for making my grandfather's 99th birthday so incredibly special. It meant the world to me, to my family, and especially to "Dude."
