Senior Minister's Message



Will the Real Human Being Stand Up?

“For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family.”

Romans 8:29

The book of Romans is a letter to the early Church in Rome about how God's love (demonstrated in the death of Christ) is so great that it makes it possible for something imperfect (the human) to be united with what is perfect (God). St. Paul wasn't just playing around with ideas; he wanted people of faith to understand and embrace the new life to which they are called.

God's love is the ultimate security. We need only to look at the cross to see that love and only to open our hearts to experience that life-changing freedom. If we do nothing other than help people to this point, we will have fulfilled our ministry as a Church.

But there is more, here in the letter to the Christians in Rome. Paul makes the point that when we faithfully participate in God's redemption of the world, we become more fully human. When we receive and embrace God's love by living faithfully, we become what God created humans to be, fellow sharers of this love with God and for one another.

This may sound sweet, but it is a powerful and spiritual threat to any nation or community that is not characterized by love of God and neighbor. This love has the power to change whole ways of living. A culture obsessed with money and stuff, crushing the deeply destitute, may be transformed into one that looks after the “least of these.”

For Paul, God's love is the truest knowledge. Living in that knowledge is thus the truest way to be a human. And the way to live in that knowledge is to love the world in the same way that God loves the world, in the same way that God loves us.

It is true that humans can be horrible. But the real human is one who loves like God loves.

Christian Formation: Embracing the Unfinished Project



Open loops, unfinished business, loose ends, and papers strewn over a desk waiting for the job to be completed before being filed can create open-ended anxiety. At times when nothing feels neat or put together properly, we fear judgment. Our anxiety might speak into us--these papers show a lack of attention, those loose ends a lack of planning, and the open loops reveal a lack of ability. But, these are not the judgments of God.

Christians celebrate Pentecost, when the chaotic sounds of the apostles speaking in different languages they did not know marks the new way Jesus shows up in the world. The book of Acts describes them trying to figure out what it means to live like and with Jesus. While they have the testimony of the Hebrew scriptures to keep them rooted in God's mighty deeds, they are learning *to become* the temple through which God acts rather than going to the temple to hear of God's acts.

So, completeness, while it feels satisfying, is overrated. When a puzzle is all put together, the fun is over, and the puzzler takes it apart to begin a new one. The fun is in putting it together.

I'm working with you to create a strong and vibrant program for Christian Formation that roots our church in God's mighty deeds as we learn to be the people through which God acts. At this time, the various pieces we have, like a puzzle, are being examined and sorted, by myself and what I hope is a growing team of teachers, Christian Ed Board members, parents, and young people. Each one has an important part to play in putting together the whole together.

Meanwhile, we will remain rooted in some of our favorite traditions.

Christian Ed is sponsoring an all church family (and extended family) Beach day for July 11th at Corona del Mar.

Membership is hosting a game day on August 1st at Pilgrim.

And our Rally Sunday is in place for September 20th where we will bless our teachers and honor the new recipient of the Dr. Merjanian award.

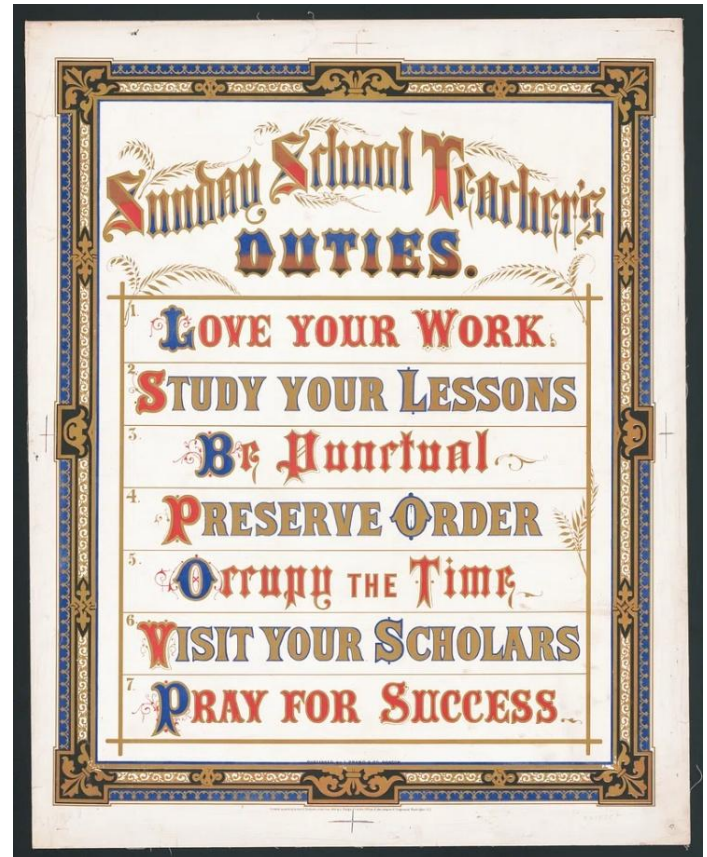

The AV Fundraising had a great start in the month of May and leading into June and we continue to make the donation options available – we are so thankful for the continued generosity of our Congregation. Technical and architectural assessments are ongoing for the improvements being made throughout the campus, which will be used to provide the correct information for the contractors. We are happy to announce that we are also installing systems which will be used campus-wide and for enhancing our rental capabilities, which include a new PA system.

Master Plan: Outlines of the various upgrades the committee recommends are printed and available for your review, they can be found in Pilgrim Hall.

Fundraising: Our fundraising efforts will continue while we commence the implementation of improvements. The Committee has envelopes for in-person donations, and has Push Pay available for those who prefer to donate that way. Donations may also be made during the Offering at Sunday Worship Services. Timeline:

- July – September:** Commence implementation of improvements
- October – January:** Finalize installations and develop operational manuals and training

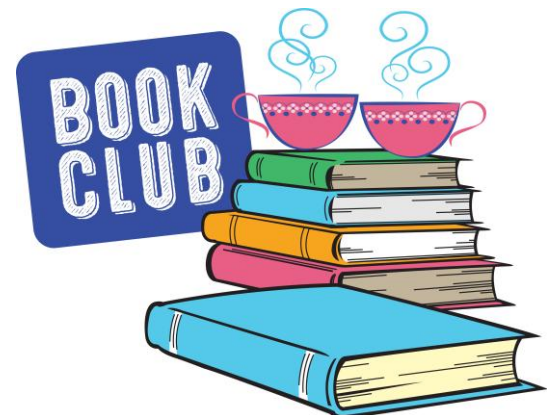
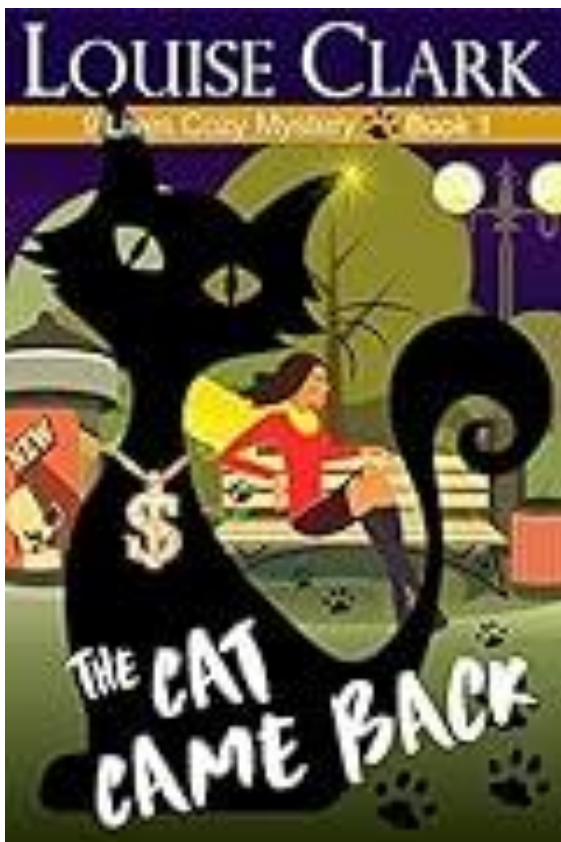
JULY 2026 LIBRARY NEWS
