Senior Minister's Message



Christlike

“Regard others as better than yourselves.”

Philippians 2:3

Paul, in this message to the Christians in Philippi, exhorts his listeners to be like Christ in their relations to one another. And this means, above all else, to live in humility as Christ did, “to regard others as better than yourselves.”

There are cultural forces all around us that urge us to act arrogantly and selfishly, to put ourselves and our interests above all others. Many of these same forces were present in the first century in the Greek city of Philippi.

Early Christians argued with one another about dietary restrictions and how religious holy days should be observed. Paul asked them to stop fighting about these issues and urged his listeners to consider that the source of these contentious disagreements was a lack of humility. If we didn't think so highly of ourselves, we wouldn't think so highly of our opinions in a disagreement.

Paul is not saying that you can't have an opinion or that you can't be right about something important. He is saying that the unity of the Church is more important than our opinions. This might be a difficult teaching for Protestants and especially Congregationalists, who put so much emphasis upon the freedom of the individual in matters of faith and how that has played out in our history of forming new denominations.

But I think this message fits well with our Congregational heritage of trusting the spiritual competency of each individual. The point is that, for Paul, we ought to acknowledge the lack of hierarchies in the Church. There are differences and a diversity of members, and there are leaders and various roles for the members, but in Christ we are all united in our humble submission to one another. We all share the same ultimate authority, and we acknowledge this by not thinking too highly of ourselves.

So, Paul calls us to be like Christ, to submit ourselves, rather than trying to force our opinions upon others. This humility is, I think, the fundamental feature of what it means to be Christlike.

Associate Minister's Message



In a journal entry, Len, a divorced man with three children, wrestles with the idea of wanting to remarry. Len writes many words explaining to the voices in his head of judgmental believers how his first wife was an alcoholic and how long he held on hoping she could be well.

How much time do we spend answering that Greek chorus of judgment rather than listening for God?

As Len wrote, he remembered how he prayed for a new love and how God led him to the exact person who was ready to love him and his children. His wrestling turned to celebration.

It is when you no longer need to explain that you find yourself. The moment when you don't have to tell the story of why you had to do what you did to the world marks a tectonic movement of spirit. Inner peace is not won by justification. It is a gift for those who stop saying "I'm sorry" and, instead, focus with gratitude on the Eternal One's love.

As I've come to know the people of Pilgrim Congregational Church, it is clear to me that you strive to resist becoming part of that Greek chorus of judgment and instead hold onto what is good and beautiful and possible in each person. Where there is brokenness, you leave the door open for reconciliation and celebrate when someone chooses to enter in. With wisdom and grace, you let God be God, trusting the Eternal One to bring about change that allows someone to freely love and live.

Because of who you are, I pray for, and celebrate when, people find their way into Pilgrim's historic sanctuary and community of Christian love.

We have implemented some new strategies to reach out to our community, inviting them into the gift that is Pilgrim Congregational Church.

To assist with our Social Media invitations, we have hired Joe Hernandez as a media consultant. I provide the content, he beautifies it, and does the technical work needed to send it out. He is also working with our website, www.pilgrimchurchpomona.com. Take a look, share our posts, and send our website to someone you know.

On September 19th, we will provide an interactive booth and presence at the Children's Festival in downtown Pomona, next to their new playground. The festival, whose theme is Superheroes, is from 10am – 2pm. You can volunteer to help make our booth visually inviting, interact with participants, and guide our costuming as we are encouraged to dress up.

These are institutional strategies. And, while good, the most effective invitation is your inviting a friend to come with you. I encourage you to pray about who you can invite to Rally Sunday, September 20th. Pilgrim will be at her best with our choir singing, Sunday School classes ready for a new Biblical exploration, and a Hamburger Bash Fellowship afterwards with a few games all can play.

And please continue to pray with me that our invitations bring new people into this community of gratitude and freedom found in Christ's reconciling love.

Dear Pilgrim,

The AV Committee tested out the new "Owl Cam" at the August Church Council meeting with very positive feedback. We are working to complete this package so that it is ready for any conference room needs. This new camera is an all-in-one speaker, microphone, and camera specifically designed for hosting online meetings. It works seamlessly with Zoom and is something we can now offer for renters looking for a large conference room. After we finish in the conference room we will focus on the Sanctuary which will include construction of a control booth to keep the equipment secure and looking good. We also will be looking at projectors to help the Music Department bring back the much-loved silent movies in the Sanctuary.

We also wish to express our gratitude to everyone who has shared opinions and donated to the fundraiser. As of early August, there has been nearly \$18,000 raised! Everyone's generosity is so amazing, thank you!

Master Plan: Outlines of the various upgrades the committee recommends are printed and available for your review, and they can be found in Pilgrim Hall.

Fundraising: Our fundraising efforts will continue while we commence the implementation of improvements. The Committee has envelopes for in-person donations, and has Push Pay available for those who prefer to donate that way. Donations may also be made during the Offering at Sunday Worship Services. Please mark the envelope for the A/V Fundraiser.

Timeline:

- **September – January 2027:** Finalize equipment list with installation and construction plans, schedule installations, and develop operational manuals and training
- **Ongoing:** Continue to evaluate the needs and implement changes to accommodate accordingly

By moving forward with this project, it is our goal to create a more meaningful worship experience, strengthen our facilities, and extend our ministry into the surrounding community. We are deeply grateful for the faithful generosity and continued support of our church congregation. 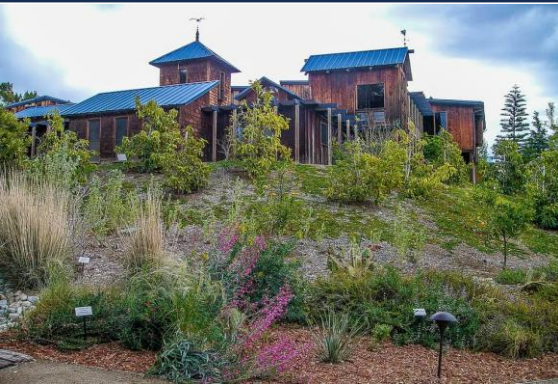

The Joyful Endeavors group is in the process of organizing a Sept. 24 tour by Pilgrim members to the Sam and Alfreda Maloof Foundation for Arts & Crafts in Rancho Cucamonga.

At least 10 people are needed so we can receive the group rate of \$25 per person. The Sept. 24 tour itself will run from 10 a.m. to noon at Maloof's unique hand-built historic home at 5131 Carnelian St.

Sam Maloof, who grew up in Chino, was one of the greatest woodworkers of the 20th century. His unique talent was recognized when he was the first craft person to receive the MacArthur Fellowship (the MacArthur Genius grant.)

His work is appreciated by private collectors, and many widely respected institutions. The Smithsonian, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, The Boston Museum of Fine Arts and The White House Craft Collection are among elite institutions who display classic Maloof designs and workmanship first hand.
